 marry then for all my Estate not already given away to be equally
 divided between my Wife Delia Meacham and my three children
 Lewis, Elizabeth, & Delia Meacham to them & their heirs forever
 I appoint my Son Henry Meacham the Sole Executor to this my
 Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and Seal this 2. day of November 1808
