People near to us, I Elizabeth Moore of Northampton County, State of
North Carolina being of Perfect mind and memory, do constitute and
appoint this my last will and testament, utterly revoking and annulling
all former wills and bequests by me heretofore made - and as touching
such worldly estate wherewith I have pleased God to bless me with in
this life I give devise and bequest of the same in the following manner, To wit
that is to say, after the death of my self & my beloved husband William
C. Moore, I give and bequest unto my living son, Washington Moore
and his heirs lawfully begotten of his own body, if he should live to
sufficiently age to have such share, but if not to be equally divided
amongst my three sons James Wright, Stephen Lawrence and
Edwards William Moore to him the said Washington or them the
said James Stephen and Edwards and his or them their heirs as the
case may be, all the land and plantations whercon we now live
as well that which fell to me by the last will and testament of my
Father James Dickinson dec'd as that by the death of my half brother
Cuthbert Dickinson dec'd, the whole containing by actual Survey Six
hundred & fifty four Acres, to him the said Washington Moore or James
Wright, Stephen Lawrence & Edwards William Moore, him or them &
their heirs as the case may be, to have and to hold, possess & enjoy with
all its appurtenances after the expiration of the above mentioned time.
In testimony whereof I the said Elizabeth Moore have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this 16th day of April in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eleven.

James Sharrard's Will. In the name of God Amen I
James Sharrard of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina
being of Sound mind and memory, do present sheweth to God for the
soul's and bettering to mind, the mortality of my body do make and ordain
this my last will and testament in manner & form following (Wt) -
To wit, it is my Will and desire that my body should be buried in a
Christian like manner and my estate to defray the expences thereof and

After paying all my just debts and funeral expences hereunto
and desire that the balance of my estate be disposed in manner
hereby expressed, to my living wife, I do hereby give bequest and
and from following (Wt) I do hereby give and bequest unto my son and
heir after the death of my deceased wife Ann Sharrard
my plantation with the land adjoining thereto bounded as follows, viz.
Beginning at a corner tree standing on the great Branch, running with a
line of marked trees a line that divides the land that I do now possess
and corners in Elliot Fittell's line, then with the said Fittell's line to
William Haggott's line, then with the said Haggott's line to the great
Branch, then down the great Branch to the first Station. Then
I give and bequest to my son William Sharrard all the com-
mon part of my Land (Wt) Beginning at the corner tree of the di-
viding line mentioned in the foregoing, to my son James Sharrard &
standing on the great Branch, then down the great Branch to Elliot
Fittell and William Fittell's line, then with these lines to a corner
tree of the said dividing line, then with the said dividing line to
the first Station. - Then, it is my further will and desire that
if either of my said sons should die under age and without issue
surviving to the age of twenty one years then it is my will & desire
that the survivor should have the whole of my said lands. Then,
I give and bequest unto my grand daughter Sally Chapman one acre
Wheel, and also one cutting Wheel, which her father James Chapman
now in possession. Then, I give and bequest unto my grand son
Anderson Chapman one to other acre which his father James Chapman
now in possession. Then - I give and bequest unto my grand son
Peterson Samner one acre which his father Samuel Samner has now
in possession one acre & land & one bar line. Then, my further
will and desire is that all the remainder part of my estate of every
kind whatever after the death of my deceased wife Ann
Sharrard be equally divided among my three daughters, Mary
Sharrard, Elizabeth Sharrard and Sally Sharrard. Lastly, I do
hereby appoint my Executors, Elliot Fittell and William Cham-
-and whole and sole Executors to this my last will and testament.
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 8th Day of October 1814.
