In the name of God Amen. I John Parker of Northampton
here County in the province of North Carolina being weak
in Body but of perfect mind & memory and thank be given
to God calling to mind the shortness of my Body & knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die & to
appear before his last Will & Testament that I do hereby give
and bequeath all that I own & do command my Executor the
hand of Almighty God that gave it & my Body I recommend
to the Care to be buried in decent Christian Burial
at the direction of my Executors, nothing doubting but at
the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God as touching such worldly Estate
as I have which it pleases God to bless me with in this
life I give & devise & dispose of the same in the following
manner & form, first of all my Will & desire is that my
debts be collected by my Executors & my just debts paid.

Then I give to my Son Aaron Parker one hundred & fifty Acres
of Land more or less

Then I give to my Son William Parker one hundred & fifty
Acres of Land more or less

I give to my Daughter Lucy Vaughan one hundred & twenty
Acres of Land more or less

I give to John William John Shilling, Esq.
I give to Henry Parker, Esq. Shilling, Esq.

I give to Sally Polk Esq. Shilling, Esq.

I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Parker one hundred & twenty
Acres of Land more or less

I give to my Grand Daughter Abigail Parker one hundred & twenty
Acres of Land more or less

I give to my Grand Daughter Priscilla Parker one hundred & twenty
Acres of Land more or less

I give to my Grand Daughter Lucy Parker my plantation with
all the rest of my Land that I have not
before this time in this will also I do

Aaron Parker & my Son William Parker & my Daughter
Lucy Vaughan I appoint my Son Aaron Parker & my Son William
Parker my Executors to pay my last Will & Testament perform
thereunto set my Hand & give my Seal this the sixth

In the name of God Amen. In the Year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred & six on the twelfth day
of December I Elizabeth K. Randolph of North Carolina & now
of Northampton, being in good health & sound Memory
thanks be given unto Almighty God. Therefore calling unto
Mind the mortality & knowing that it is appointed for me
to die, I do hereby give & devise & dispose of the same
in the following manner & form - first of all I give & recommend
my Soul into the protection of him that gives it
and as touching such worldly Estate as I have which it pleases
God to bless me with I give & devise & dispose of
the same in the following manner & form -
My Will is that if I should die without issue
an issue to myself that for the Affection I have for my
beloved Brother Bryan Randolph, I give & bequeath
unto him the said Bryan Randolph one of my Negro
named Cupia & Prada to him & his Heirs forever if I
should have more than this Will to be void otherwise
remain in full force & effect
