In the name of God Amen, I, Seth Peckes of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being of perfect mind and memory knowing it is appointed for all men once to die as the 16th day of January one thousand eight hundred and ten make and obtain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, first of all I give my just debts paid, My Will is I give unto my beloved Wife Mary or Negroes to wile, black fancy manacle, baby, Riza, Sam and their increase forever to dispose of as she may think proper, I also leave unto my beloved, Wile Mary all the rest of my Negroes that I have not given her, with all the stock of horses cattle dogs sheep, also all my lands Household and Kitchen furniture plantation utensils as long as she lives and at her death my will is that Deborah and Pat the two old Negroes my Wile had when I married her shall be set free, I think they have both merited their freedom for their faithfulness - I give unto Seth Peckes son of my Wile's Nathaniel ~~Peckes~~ provided he will live on my lands, all my lands all my Negroes not given to my Wile, all my stock of every kind Hous hold and Kitchen furniture plantation utensils with all and every thing not heretofore named with the increase of all the Negroes given him, to him and his heirs forever provided he comes to the age of twenty one years, I give all to him with a charge that he treats them with humanity and should be an slave before he arrives to that age - as I do not wish my Negroes separated, I give unto Henry Peckes brother to Seth Peckes was son of my brother Nathaniel all the Negroes land and every thing given to the man above named, Seth Peckes to him and his heirs forever - and I do by these presents make and appoint my Wile to be my Executor and my friends Charles Malone and Presley Pritchard my Executors to this my last will and Testament, revoking all others that may have been made - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written

 make and declare this my last Will and Testaments

 boy by the name of Abraham to him and his heirs forever
- Item Give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Cook
 one bay mare also one feather bed and furniture
 to her and her heirs forever.
- Item Give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Cook
 one feather bed and furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give unto my son John Cook all the remaining part
 of my estate not above mentioned to him and his heirs
 forever
- And I do hereby nominate and appoint my worthy
 friends Elizabeth Taylor and John Pables my sole
 and true Executors of this my last will and Testament
 and I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this Twentieth day of May in the Year of our
 Lord one thousand Eight hundred & Eleven

Salomon Summers Will

Salomon Summers of the County of Northampton and State of
 North Carolina being sick and feeling myself to death, do at this
 time of sound mind and memory make this my last Will
 and Testament revoking all others by me heretofore made
 therefore Give and bequeath my goods and chattels as follows
 To-wit: I desire that all my just debts should be paid —
 Secondly I desire that my Mother Charlotte Summers shall have
 my money still and my negro Woman Lucy serving her
 natural life and after her death to my sister Mary
 Summers to her & her heirs forever —
 Thirdly if the balance of my estate is more than will
 pay my just debts I give it to my sister Mary
 Summers at my death — Fourthly I appoint William
 Brewer and my Mother Charlotte Summers my
 Executors — July 22nd 1812 —
