him and his heirs forever.

Item It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid and
General Expenses and all the remaining part of my property
not before mentioned shall be equally divided between my wife
Mary Mann and my three daughters, to wit; Elizabeth Mann, Mary
Mann and Sarah Mann at their discretion or as they may
choose to have and their heirs forever. And I do nominate and
appoint my two Sons John Mann and Jason Mann my two Executors
to and sole Executress of this my last will and Testament. I do
also, at this will supersede made by me As WITNESS my self
and Seal this 15th day of June 1822.

William Richardson's Will. In the name of our
Ames. William Richards of the County of Northampton, State of
N Carolina, being in perfect mind & memory thank be to God
for the same but calling to mind the mortality of my body
and that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in truth and
privately I give and bequeath my Suit to Clothing good
my bedstead in whom I trust through the mercies of God
& portion of my beloved Garrison Jesus Christ, that my soul
shall be saved, & my body I desire may be buried in a Christian
like manner at the discretion of my Executors here
after named & as to my worldly goods which it had pleased
God to bestow on me in this life I give & bequeath as
follows - Imprimis. My will and desire is that all my just
debts be paid and discharged. Item. I give and bequeath unto
my living wife Nancy Richards the land and plantation on which
we now live during her life, the lands are not to be set nor divided
more than what will be sufficient for the convenience of the plan-
tation. I also give to her one Negro Woman named Ally, but
her increase to my children, of my Stock, two horses and Horses
and Saddles, two cows & Calves, two Sheep & pigs and a sufficiency
of Corn and pork for one years provision.

Item. I desire for all my property to be left together until some
R. Richards becomes of age, unless my wife should die before
that time, then I desire that the balance of my property be equally
divided among my children (namely) Eliza Richards,
Martha Richards, Rebecca Richards, Letitia Richards, William
Richards, Nancy Richards, Randolph Richards & James R. Richards.

Item. I desire one acre of ground around the old farm house for
privileges of the connection as a burying ground.

Item. My will and desire is that the only gift property Richard
and (Mrs John) Lewisold by my Executrix when they die for

And I do hereby nominate and appoint my Son Nathan & Richard & William Richards their Step Executors of my last Will and Testaments and I do by these presents acknowledge the same to be my last Will and Testaments according to the terms in my Will by one Lawyer made. I Susannah Gurns of Northampton County being of sound and perfect mind (blessed be God) at this 28th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven make and publish this my last Will and Testaments in manner following, that is to say. First. I give unto my Son Abraham Gurns one half of my negro man bats and one stock of hogs to him and his heirs forever. I give unto my son Nathan Gurns one dollar, 50c. I give unto my daughter Ruth Gurns one pound, one iron wheel one blue shirt and twenty dollars in money and one bushel peat of my father and brother's wood to her and her heirs forever my desire that she live one story there and all one part of my land to live on as long as she lives single I give unto my daughter Ruth Gurns one bottle shad and four loaves the best bacon my brother is kept in we shall eat

the fourth part of my pasture and brother one & brother's son wife forever take I give unto my Daughter Deborah Room one third and one fourth of my pasture and brother's son wife to her and her heirs forever & the fifth part of my Son Humphrey farms all the land and plantation that was given to me by my late Husband in his last Will one half of my negro man bats all my Stock of cattle and sheep, one mile, one pair of iron scalds and house Lot and Kitchen furniture and all the balance of my Estate, already given away to him and his heirs forever—
I hereby make & Ordain my Son Humphrey Gurns the Executor of this my last Will and Testaments, In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the day and date and above written.
