

Of my Negroes that should come after the date of this my Will should go with their clothes as they are devised to each of them and their heirs forever. Item I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth my ffig, and thence three work horses, four cows and calves four pigs, two feather beds and furniture, my shoes, and all my other household ware, and fifty barrels of corn and two thousand weights of pork to her and her heirs forever. Item I send unto my beloved wife Elizabeth over black and lock hair two tables two chairs dressing her natural life, and after her death I give the black and lock hair and tables to my daughter Martha Maria; to her and her heirs forever. Item I give unto my son James three horses say black red blooded & bay mare, four cows & calves four pigs and two feather beds & furniture, two tables one desk fifty barrels of corn and two thousand weights of pork, and after the death of my wife I give him the chairs black hair to him and his heirs forever. Item I give unto my daughter Martha Maria two feather beds and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

My Will and Desire is after the death of my wife that the said land her should be equally divided the number of shares and the part the houses is and I give to my son Henry to him and his heirs forever. Item I give the other parts of my land after the death of my wife to my daughter Martha Maria to her & her heirs forever.

Item Heretofore is six Negroes that I have not given away, if my Will can be discharged without selling of them, though my will is that they be divided as I shall hereafter direct. Item my will & desire is that all my estate that I have not given away or lent should be sold by my Executors & attorney arising to

discharge all my last debts and after all paid, if any remaining with the six Negroes above named to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth and my following children, Thomas D. Evans, Henry & Martha Maria Hollamons to them and each of them & their heirs forever. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my dear son Thomas D. & Emma Hollamons my sole and sole Executors of this my last Will and testament discharging all other this to be my Will whereby I shall hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of June 1808 & twenty.

Jonathan Roberts's will In the name of God Amen. I Jonathan Roberts of Northampton County & State of North Carolina, being of the State of North, but in my right mind and memory, do make and declare this my last Will and testament, this 27th day of July 1808 that I do hereby give and bequeath in manner and form following (Viz) I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Roberts the plantation whereon I now live with all the appurtenances, and one thousand acres, and all my stock of cattle, sheep, and pigs, together with all my plantation tools, two feather beds and furniture, two tables, & two chairs, *Emma last named* my daughter

And at her Death in marriage, I give and bequeath all the above mentioned property to my son James Roberts to him and his heirs forever. Item 3rd. I give to my son Willis Roberts the sum of five Shillings. Item 4th. I give to my daughter Melinda Ross the sum of five Shillings. Item 5th. I give to my daughter Rebecca Stacey the sum of five Shillings. Item 6th. I give to my son Ransom Roberts one Parcel of land and the sum of five Shillings to him and his heirs forever.

Item 7th. I give to my son Phaniel Roberts the sum of five Shillings.

Item 8th. I give to my daughter Mary Roberts the sum of five Shillings.

Item 9th. I give to my granddaughter Rebecca Roberts one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Willis Roberts my Executor to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year before mentioned.

Matthew Buffalaw's Will. In the name of God, Amen: I Matthew Buffalaw of the County of Northampton & State of N. Carolina being in common health & of perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows (to wit) I bequeath to my wife Nancy Buffalaw Seventy Acres of Land where my dwelling house stands, two feather beds &c with all my household and kitchen furniture with all my

Plantations situated, my stock of every kind, with one Negro slave to me, and at the death of my wife I give the seventy Acres of Land which I bequeath to my wife to my son William Buffalaw to be sold and equally divided among my four daughters, namely, Josephine, Lucy, Martha & Mary Buffalaw all to regulate the property not given away. — I give to my daughter Josephine one parcel of furniture I give to my daughter Lucy one bed & furniture. I give to my daughter Mary one bed & furniture to have their share & I give the only last land lying in Sampson County N. Carolina I give one half to my son William Buffalaw according to our previous agreement the other half I leave to my four children to be equally divided, namely, William, Josephine, Lucy, Martha & Mary. — I lend my wife one hundred dollars. — I leave & appoint my son William Buffalaw sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. I do hereby revoke & disannul all & every other former testaments, In Witness my hand & Seal this 1st day of June 1830.
