 hereby make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in
 manner and form following. - First and foremost I recom-
 mend the Soul to God who first gave it in hope of a joyful
 resurrection of the same and as to what worldly goods it has
 pleased God to bless me with I do dispose of in the following man-
 ner. Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha
 B. B. B. after my daughter Mary Stanton receiving her part
 or lot hereafter named one third part of the residue of my land
 to be laid off on the South side of my land and the following na-
 med negroes which she had already recd. namely Green Sells Ed-
 am Annica Esther and Timmy also negro women Moll one
 bedstead bed furniture the fifth choice to her and her heirs
 forever. Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Henry
 Stanton the tract of land whereon he now lives which he has
 a deed for supposed to be three hundred acres more or less and
 the following named negroes Jerry and big Eady which he has
 already recd. also negroman Math Dickey and Charles one bed-
 stead bed furniture forth choice to him and his heirs for-
 ever. Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter
 Mary Stanton the following tract or parcel of land begin-
 ning at a White Oak on the Halifax Road on the South
 Side

side of the Murfreesborough Road. thence running nearly East
 until it strikes the Murfreesborough road thence down said
 road to Giddards line a pine also on the North side of said
 road and thence also the following named negroes Abram Pat
 Caroline Harris Lucy and Carson also one bedstead bed
 furniture and three Counterpins all first choice and one
 third part of all my household and Kitchen furniture viz.
 Chest of Drawers Looking glasses Cupboard Tables five Iron
 Looms & Harrow with every other article of household and Kitchen
 on furniture of every description one large Copper Kettle one

Five Iron Loom & harness with every other article of household and kitchen furniture of every description one large Copper Kettle grind Stone Stock of horses cattle and hogs riding Chair Wagon and Harness plantation Wheelbarrow and tools of every description corn fodder tub wheat bason Lard brandy casks and stands of every description to her and her heirs forever. Item 6th My crop of Cotton now on hand I will to be sold by my Executor hereafter named and the money arising from the sale of said Cotton to go to the payments of my just debts and other expenses that may occur the balance of said money I wish equally divided between my son Henry and four daughters within named. And Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint William H. Hardie my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 23rd day of March 1824

In the name of God Amen I Henry Sutor of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being low in health but of sound mind and disposing memory - Calling to mind that all mankind must die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament First I give and bequeath unto my two supposed daughters, daughters of Elizabeth Pilkington seven hundred and fifty Dollars each the interest of which of which my will and desire is should be applied to their support annually until they arrive to lawful age or marry at which times my will and desire is that the said legacies of seven hundred and fifty Dollars should be paid to them by my brother Benjamin Sutor his Exor or Admors whom I appoint their Testamentary Guardian for my will and desire is that if either the above named children should die before they arrive to the age of twenty one or marry the said legacies should go to my brother Benjamin Sutor And I do hereby bequeath the same to him and his heirs forever. Secondly - I give and bequeath unto William Stevenson one bond & hold against him at this time and my will and desire is that my Executor hereinafter named should deliver the same to him. Thirdly - I give and bequeath unto Mrs Jane Williams the sum of one hundred Dollars as a compensation to her for her attention to me in my sickness to her and her heirs forever. - Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my brother Benjamin Sutor the whole of the balance of my Estate that I have not herein before given away after paying my just debts, of every description of property debts due me and money that I am possessed of in any way whatsoever to him and his heirs forever.
