State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound and  
disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the mortal-  
ity of man and that it is appointed for man once to die I do  
heavily make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in  
manner and form following. - First and foremost I recom-  
mend the Soul to God who first gave it in hope of a Joyful  
resurrection of the same and as to what worldly goods it had  
pleased God to bless me with I do dispose of in the following man-  
ner. Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha  
Stanton, after my daughter Mary Stanton receiving her part  
or lot hereafter named one third part of the residue of my land  
to be laid off on the south side of my land and the following na-  
med negroes which she had already recd. namely Green Sells Ad-  
am Annica Esther and Sinny also negro women Moll one  
bedstead bed furniture the fifth choice to her and her fore-  
ever. Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my son Henry J  
Stanton the tract of land whereon he now lives which he has  
a deed for supposed to be three hundred acres more or less and  
the following named negroes Jerry and big Eady which he has  
already recd. also negroman Math Dukey and Charles one bed-  
stead bed furniture forth choice to him and his heirs fore-  
ever. Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter  
Mary Stanton the following tract or parcel of land begin-  
ning at a White Oak on the Halifax Road on the south  
Side.

that the said legacies of seven hundred and fifty Dollars should  
be paid to them by my brother Benjamin Suter his Exor or  
Admor whom I appoint their Testamentary Guardian fur-  
ther my will and desire is that if either the above named children  
should die before they arrive to the age of twenty one or mar-  
ry the said legacies should go to my brother Benjamin Suter  
And I do hereby bequeath the same to him and his heirs fore-  
ver. Secondly - I give and bequeath unto William Stevenson  
one bond & hold against him at this time and my will  
and desire is that my Executor hereinafter named should  
deliver the same to him. Thirdly - I give and bequeath unto  
Mrs Jane Williams the sum of one hundred Dollars as a com-  
pensation to her for her attention to me in my sickness to her  
and her heirs forever. - Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto  
my brother Benjamin Suter the whole of the balance of my  
Estate that I have not herein before given away after pay-  
ing my just debts, of every description of property debts due  
me and money that I am possessed of in any way whatso-  
ever to him and his heirs forever. I do nominate and  
appoint my brother my brother Benjamin Suter
