And Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint William H. Hardie my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 23rd day of March 1824

Thirdly - I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Jane Williams the sum of one hundred Dollars as a compensation to her for her attention to me in my sickness to her and her heirs forever. - Fourthly - I give and bequeath unto my brother Benjamin Sutor the whole of the balance of my Estate that I have not herein before given away after paying my just debts, of every description of property debts due me and money that I am possessed of in any way whatsoever to him and his heirs forever. James Rose's Will. — I James Rose of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound memory do this 26th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one make and Ordain: this my last will & in manner & form as followeth (that is to say). 1st First I give and bequeath unto my Son Stephen Rose the land within the following boundaries: beginning at Stephen Rose Corner Pine; thence running west to my fence, thence along my fence nearly north the direct course to John Weavers line. thence along his line to said Stephen Rose line thence along his line to the first Station containing five acres more or less and all the estate & acc'ts. I have against him to him and his heirs forever.

2nd Secondly. — I give and bequeath unto my Son Cornelius Rose the balance of my land whenon I live containing one hundred & five acres more or less and the horse I have & my

my cattle and saddles to him and his heirs forever. 3rd Thirdly. — I give and bequeath unto my Son in law Edwards a note I have against him amounting to twenty five Dollars and fifty Cents with the Interest to him and his heirs forever. — 4th Fourthly. — I give unto my grand daughter Elizabeth daughter of James — Horse five Dollars each in cash to be paid to them when they are of age to receive it to them & their heirs forever. 5th Fifthly. — I give and bequeath unto my Son in law James Horne one Dollar in cash to him & his heirs forever. 6th Sixthly and Lastly. — I give my will and desire that my Son Cornelius Rose and my daughter Elizabeth Edwards have each of them a father bed and furniture. And I give to my Son Stephen Rose the cattle that he had now in his possession of some and all the balance of my property of every description to be equally divided between my Son Stephen Rose & Cornelius Rose & my daughter Elizabeth Edwards. — And I nominate and appoint my son Cornelius Rose my Executor to this my last will in manner as above written.
