Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah Hay one dollar to her & her heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Donnet Edwards four dollars besides his proportionable part of my property with others as will be mentioned. Item I further my will and desire that all my property may be sold and all my just debts paid and after that the balance equally divided between my son Howell Tannor my daughter Elizabeth Tannor and my daughter Patsy Tannor and my grandson Donnet Edwards to them and their heirs forever. And I do appoint Henry Balmour my executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking all other Will or Wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
