People over to in S. Elizabeth Moore of Northampton County, White of
North Carolina being of Perfect mind and memory, do constitute and
appoint this my last will and Testament, utterly revoking and annulling
all former wills and bequests by me heretofore made - and as touching
such worldly estate whereunto I have pleased God to bless me with in
this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner To-wit
that is to say, after the death of my self & my beloved husband William
C. Moore, I give and bequeath unto my loving son, Washington Moore
and his heirs lawfully begotten of his own body, if he should live to
sufficient age to have such share, but if not to be equally divided
amongst my three sons James Wright, Stephen Lawrence and
Edwards William Moore to him the said Washington or them the
said James Stephen and Edwards and his or them their heirs as the
case may be, all the land and plantations whereon we now live
as well that which fell to me by the last will and Testament of my
Father James Dickinson dec'd. as that by the death of my half Brother
Cotton Dickinson dec'd, the whole containing by actual Survey five
hundred & fifty four Acres, to him the said Washington Moore or James
Wright, Stephen Lawrence & Edwards William Moore, him or them &
their heirs at the case may be, to have and to hold, possess & enjoy with
all its appurtenances after the expiration of the above mentioned time.
In testimony whereof I the said Elizabeth Moore have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this 16th day of April in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifteen.

James Sharrard's Will. In the name of God Amen I
James Sharrard of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina
being of Sound mind and memory at present thank God for the
same, and calling to mind the mortality of my body do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner & form following (Wt) -
That I do my Will and desire that my body should be buried in a
Christian like manner and my estate to be managed as follows and

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After first paying all my just debts and funeral expenses then I do my
will and desire that the balance of my estate be divided in manner
that I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal in presence of
and four following (Wt) James and bequeath unto my son John
Sharrard after the death of his mother & my loving wife Ann Sharrard
my plantation with the land adjoining thereunto bounded as follows viz
Beginning at a corner tree standing on the great Branch running with a
line of marked trees a line that divides the land that I do now possess
and owners in Old Fattell's lot, then with the said Fattell's line to
William Maggott's line, then with the said Maggott's line to the great
Branch, then down the great Branch to the first Station. Then
I give and bequeath to my son William Sharrard all the com-
mon part of my Land (Wt) Beginning at the corner tree of the de-
ciding line mentioned in the foregoing, to my son James Sharrard &
standing in the great Branch, then down the great Branch to Old
Fattell and Lillibury Fattell's line then with these lines to a corner
tree of the said dividing line, then with the said dividing line to
the first Station. - Then, it is my further will and desire that
if either of my said sons should die under age and without issue
surviving to the age of twenty one year then it is my will & desire
that the survivor should have the whole of my said lands. Then
I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Sally all of one acre
Wheel, and also one acing Wheel which her father Thomas Sharrard has
now in possession. Then I give and bequeath unto my grand son
Anderson Sharrard one fourth part which his father Thomas Sharrard
has now in possession. Then I give and bequeath unto my grand son
Peterson Sharrard one lot which his father Samuel Sharrard has now
in possession one Cow & Lamb & one bar Line. Then my further
will and desire is that all the remainder part of my estate of every
kind whatsoever after the death or decease of my loving wife Ann
Sharrard be equally divided among my three daughters Charity
Sharrard, Elizabeth Sharrard and Sally Sharrard. Lastly, I do
hereby appoint my Executors Elliott Fattell and William Ed-
munds and do give Execution to this my last will and Testament.

this 8th Day of October 1814.
