I give and bequeath unto Sarah Jackson daughter of William Jackson  
one bed & furniture one hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto Josiah Edwards two hundred dollars to him  
and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto all the property I do purposed to

divided between the offspring of Isabella Ross and Darling Lewis to them and  
their heirs forever.

I give my will and devise is that my negro not already disposed of shall have  
liberty of choosing a master or mistress provided such person or persons will  
give their value and not otherwise.

I constitute and appoint my beloved brother William Jackson and my  
trusty friend Richard Whistler executors to this my last Will and Testament. In  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 28<sup>th</sup>  
day of November 1814

Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in my body but  
in my perfect senses and memory, knowing that it is appointed for all  
men to die make this my last Will and Testament, I resign my soul to its  
Creator in all humble hope of its future happiness or in the disposal of a  
being infinitely good, as is my body my will is that it be buried near that  
of my parents, and as for my worldly estate which the Lord hath been  
pleased to bless me with, I give and dispose of in the following manner,  
viz: I give and my dear uncle Nicholas Dyer after paying my just  
debts all my estate consisting of lands negro slaves of all kinds household  
and kitchen furniture to be paying to my brother or other Dyer living either  
to him the said Nicholas Dyer and his heirs forever to this my last Will &  
Testament, this is my last Will and Testament written with my own hand  
and sealed with my own seal this 6<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our  
Lord 1815
