 Rhoda Martin one negro girl named Letitia and one boy named
 Isaac two other beds and furniture. Twelvethly, I give my
 son Charles Martin twelve dollars, and also Eighty dollars that
 I have lent him before, and also the land where our house lies
 The balance of the stock left for the use of the plantation.
 I likewise constitute, make and ordain James Martin and
 Jacobus Martin the sole executors of this my last will and
 Testament. And I do hereby utterly disavow and disown all and
 every other former testaments, wills and legacies, by me in anywise
 before named. Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
 last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have here
 unto set my hand and seal this eighth day of August in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

This Will of Etheldred Martin dec. was offered for probate, & approved by the Justs of Matthew M. Martin & all cog Martin the subscribing witnesses thereto, and a faciat being entered to the probate thereof by Henry Nelson Etheldred Martin and Henry Nelson, Guardians for the children namely, Mary Nelson, Christopher Nelson and Henry Nelson. The issue of said will not now, was ordered to be made up by the Justs another following day (Tuesday) to wit the Comrs, John Lamberton, John Woodard, John Cook, Benjamin Snow, James Fisher, James Houghton, the said Long, Rhodes, Babb, Eunice Babb, John Houghton and Joseph M. Hays, being sworn and impanelled, to try the issue joined between the parties for their Verdict as say, the paper writing exhibited is the last will and Testament of Etheldred Martin dec. therefore it is the sense of the Court that the said will be received. Whereupon James Martin and Joshua Martin the Executors in said will named, was granted as the Law directs.

 unto my son William Maugham all the balance of my estate both Real &
 Personal to him and his heirs forever. It is revocable subject to the following
 provisions Viz) Provided my said son William should die unmarried
 or in case he should marry & die without lawful issue then & in that
 case it is my will and desire that my son Thomas Maugham (now
 a Resident in the State of Georgia) and his lawful heirs should
 have & inherit all and singular the above named property given
 to my said son William. Lastly, I do now nominate and
 appoint my son William Maugham & Richard H. Brown, my
 Executors to this my last will & Testament. Signed sealed and

Nathaniel Tucker her Executor to see that which I am to give
be done. &c. In the next place, my Will & desire is, that all
the rest of my property be kept together untill my wife or
Nathaniel Tucker marry in such case my Will & desire is,
that all my personal property be divided Nathaniel Tucker & his children
as the law directs. All my Lands not given away I give to my
son Nathaniel Tucker to him his heirs and assigns forever, with all
my stock of Horses Cattle Hogs Plantations &c. &c. House
&c. & Kitchen Furniture to him the said Nathaniel Tucker
his heirs & assigns forever. And in case the said Nathaniel Tucker
should die without an heir then it is my desire that all the Estate
Lands Negroes &c. left unto Nathaniel Tucker be equally divided
between the whole heirs of said Tucker & Nathaniel Tucker to them
their heirs & assigns forever. Lastly I constitute & appoint my
son Nathaniel Tucker Executor and my wife Petition Tucker to this
my last Will & Testament, providing all these begeth as made by
me. In Testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand
I feel this thirteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred
and Twenty.

William Tuck the tract of Land I purchased of Joseph Brown and
that part of my old back of Land that lies between James Watts
line and the long branch and two Negroes Harry & Blasing and
their increase one further bed & Furniture to him & his heirs forever.
Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Tuck three Negroes
Polly, Peter & Sarah and their children one further bed & Furniture to
her & her heirs forever. Fifthly. I give and bequeath unto my son
James Tuck for all the lands that I purchased of Joseph Brown and Joseph
Casswards and all my lands that I have left to my wife after my
death and two Negroes Shady & Elizabeth and also Sam & Simon and
Mandy with all my silver back after the death of my wife & all their
increase two further beds & Furniture one horse & plantation and
the third forever. Sixthly. I give and bequeath unto my
daughter Mary Tuck for two Negroes Ned and Harmon and their increase
one further bed and Furniture to her and her heirs forever.
Seventhly. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Tuck three
Negroes Betsy, Sam & Pigs and also Pells after the death of
my wife and their increase one further bed and Furniture to her
