I Barnaba Burr of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina being weak in body — health but in perfect sense and sound mind do make and ordain this my last will of what earthly goods that has been bestowed on — I give in manner and form as followeth. — Item — I give and bequeath unto to my two supposed sons Ransom Pope and Levy Pope my land and plantations whereon I live containing one hundred acres more or less to — Equally dividedly — in quantity Between them Levy to have the lot whereon my dwelling house stands to them & their heirs forever with this exception that — I shall support Rebecca Pope during her single life. — Item. — It is my will & desire that their Mother should live with one or both or both of them & should should have her support likewise. — Item. — I give and bequeath to Rebecca Pope one serv^t man the said man to stay on my plantation to work for the support of my family and when the man should be worn out or dead the aforesaid Ransom Pope & Levy Pope shall be bound to make up to her in Stock or money to the amount of sixty dollars at the said Rebecca coming of age Item. — I give the balance of Estate both within & out doors that has not already been paid out to Ransom Pope Levy Pope & Rebecca Pope the property to stay together they come of age

and them to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever. And further I nominate and appoint my friend William Wade my Executor to this my last will and Testament, revoking all other wills made by me. In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of February 1821
