 First, I give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas W. Jenkins the following negroes (viz) Ben, Bob, Grandison, Agnes, Phillis and Spencer to him and his heirs forever.

2^{dly} I give and bequeath unto my nephew George W. Jenkins Amy and her three youngest children with her future increase, to him and his heirs forever.

3^{dly} I do give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas W. Jenkins all bonds which are now due me for the hire of my negroes and which may hereafter become due, likewise my riding mare, bridle and saddle to him and his heirs forever.

And I hereby make and ordain my brother Thomas W. Jenkins executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said George Washington Jenkins have to this my last Will and Testament, set my hand and seal, this twenty first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen.

In the name of God Amen, I Joshua Vincent of Northampton County State of North Carolina being in perfect health of body and of sound mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament viz: First of all I recommend my soul into the hands of its creator who gave it to me and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again.

I give unto my wife Lucy Vincent the following negroes, to wit, great Frank Jimmy his wife, Jude and Nelson to her forever. I give unto my two sons James Vincent & Michael Vincent the following negroes to wit Aaron, Solomon, Hall, Jeffery, great David, little David, Willie, Shadrack, Nathan, Ted, Moses, Dick, Fanny, little Jimmy, Ned and due they and their increase to them and their heirs forever, and the rest of my personal property I give unto my four daughters Sallie Jones, Polly Allen, Rebecca With and Priscilla May to share and share equally all the - I lend unto my wife Lucy Vincent the tract of land I now reside on of Northampton County during her natural life and two work horses & four head of cattle and all the household and furniture, and after her decease I give the said tract of land stock household & furniture to my two sons James Vincent and Michael Vincent forever, it is my will and desire that the rest of my stock should be sold and the money be equally divided between my two sons James Vincent & Michael Vincent after paying all my just debts that comes against my estate - It is my will and desire that Charles Harrison should act as executor upon my estate, as witness my hand & seal this 17 day of September 1811.

debts all the other personal estate of which I may die
possessed, including all monies that may be now due,
or may hereafter become due to me.

Read executor to this my last Will & Testament

Abram Gums's Will.

I Abram Gums of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina
being in my perfect senses do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament. In the first place I give and bequeath unto
my two Sisters Leas and Esther Gums all my lands lying
being in the County of Northampton aforesaid to be equally
divided between them, to them their heirs and assigns forever. -

Secondly, It is my will and desire that my two negroes
Off and Cato be hired out for four years successively, the
money arising from the hire of said negroes together with
negroes aforesaid, be at the expiration of the said Term
four years, equally divided between my two said Sisters Leas
& Esther, to them their heirs and assigns forever. -

Thirdly, It is my will and desire that all the rest of my
property be sold on a credit of six months, and the money arising
from such sale, after payment of my just debts and the
Legacies to be hereafter named be equally divided between my
two Sisters Leas and Esther as aforesaid, to them and their
heirs forever. -
