I leave & bequeath unto my dear & beloved wife Mary Weston in manner & form following Vizt -

I give & bequeath unto my Son William Weston the house & Habitation now late in, & running a Barke in & where I live to him & his heirs forever -

I give unto my Grand Daughter Mary Weston the Daughter of John Weston of Huntingdon County to her & her heirs forever -

I give unto my beloved Wife Mary Weston all the remaining part of my Estate & property here & abroad which I have & shall have & my heirs forever -

I bequeath & appoint my Friend John Weston my Son to be my last Will & Testament, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal this 15th day of February 1788
