Mary Wright's Will.

In the name of God amen I Mary Wright of Northampton County and
State of North Carolina, being in good health and possessing my usual
understanding, do make this my last Will and Testament as follows -

Imprimis It is my particular will and wish that my servant man
Agon be liberated if the laws of our County will allow of it, if not
I give and bequeath him to my nephew William Allen Eaton of Halifax
County and State of North Carolina to him his heirs & assigns forever.
my reason for wishing the above named negro freed, is that his former
master intended doing so in his Will, his good conduct towards his
master made him determine this in his favor.

Item. I give and bequeath to my niece Eiza Edwards Eaton to her and her
heirs and assigns forever a negro girl called Eady daughter of Cook Robin.

Item. I give and bequeath to Rebecca J. Jones (the wife of
Cardwallader Jones) to her, her heirs and assigns forever a negro man
named Samuels -

Item. I give and bequeath to Mary Rebecca Allen (widow) to her and
her heirs and assigns forever a negro girl named Jennett, also a boy
called Madrack -

Item. I lend to Allen J. Green Mariet Lutz and Charles during
his life, and at his death I give and bequeath them to his oldest daughter
to her and her heirs and assigns forever -

Item. I give and bequeath to Allen J. Davis to him and his heirs
and assigns forever a negro girl named Polly the daughter of Violet
provided he will purchase a Washington the youngest son of Violet
if he will not do that, I give and bequeath the said negro to
William Wright, the son of my husband, but if Allen will buy
him I give the money arising from his sale to William Wright the
son of my husband -

Item. I give and bequeath to my Nephew William Allen Eaton
to him and his heirs and assigns forever a negro man named
Polly the son of Violet -

Item. I give and bequeath to William Wright (the son of my
husband) to him and his heirs and assigns forever Homer, Colledge
Nora her two children Higgins and Abraham Bell, provided Mr
Wright my husband will dispose of Isaac and Thos of the right

my intention is that the husband wife and children should go together.
if the above conditions are not complied with I give the half of the
negroes named to William Wright to Allen Jones Eaton the son of
my brother Thomas Eaton, to him and his heirs and assigns forever
It is my desire that Edy and Violet be free, they are old and
cannot do much service -

I once more request that Aaron may be freed, and again declare
this to be my last Will and Testament written with my own
hand and sealed with my seal this 21st day of November Anno
Dom: 1810

my nephew William Allen Eaton my executor

Jamerson Futrell's Will.

In the name of God Amen I Jamerson Futrell of the County of
Northampton and State of North Carolina, being sick and weak in
body, but in sound sense and disposing memory of mind do
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following:-

Item, My will and desire is that all my just debts be paid.

Item, I leave unto my beloved wife Saby Futrell one share
Bible and saddle, one saw and Luff one saw and Pig also

one feather bed and furn chure, also one wooden wheel, also one linnen wheel
also one pot, also one pan, also one skillet, also one half dozen of Pewter
plates, also one dish, also half dozen of ~~cray~~, also one table, also one
chest, also one ax and wedging hoe, also one saw and gear, also one
tub and paul, also half dozen earthen plates also one third of the crop
now growing and after her marraige or death shal be equal divided
betwixt my said Children Jaron Futrell, John Futrell, Lewis
Futrell, Malchiah Futrell William Futrell -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Jaron Futrell, one feather be
and furniture, also one saw and pigo also one cow and calf also
one plow hoe & ax also my Cooper tools to him this leen forever -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son John Futrell one horse colt, also one
feather bed and furniture, also one ax and wedging hoe & plow hoe
also one negro boy by the name of Edum to him and his heirs forever
if he sud die without lawful heir begotten of his body shall descend
to the rest of his brothers -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Futrell one horse &
calf also one feather bed and furniture, also one ax, also one wedging
hoe also one plow hoe also one gun to him and his heirs forever -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my sons Lewis Futrell and
Malchiah Futrell and William Futrell Clearcay Viney and
her in case after my death to be sold and equal divide and if
either of them shud die without lawful heir begotten of their
body, shud descend to the rest of their brethren -

I leave my negro Woman Coby to live with any of my
family whom she pleases -

My Will and desire is that all the remainder part of my
property is to be sol and after paying my just debts to be
divided betwixt Lewis Futrell, Malchiah Futrell and William
Futrell to them and their heirs forever -

And I constitute and appoint and ordain Willie Futrell my whole
and soul executor disannulling and revoking all other Wills by
me heretofore made, as witness my hand and seal this 3rd day of
September 1811
