In the Name of God Amen I John S. Brown of the County of Northampton and State of N. Carolina being in perfect health and of sound & disposing Memory of mind do thank be to God for the same; do make & Ordain this to be my last Will & testament in manner & form following

I now leave all my just debts are paid I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy Brown one Bed and bedding also two beds and furniture including her Captain bedstead and one Black Walnut Table and looking Glass also my trunk and the two Star naphtha Cows & Calves and her choice of two Horses or Mules and one chest.

I now I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Brown Rachelle one Bedding also one Bed and furniture and one Spinning Wheel also my Water Clocks. Item I give unto my Daughters Mary Brown Aug and George and one bed and furniture also my Sister Lotta and Isa Green.

Item I give my Daughters Lucy Brown Isaac and banister and cupboard and furniture.

Now I give and bequeath unto my Son Joseph S. Brown Moses and Charlotte also one Bed and furniture as for my real Estate I give unto my Son Joseph S. Brown the Plantation lot I purchased of John White lying in the part of quarter and yarshard swamp also my interest in the Senior right of Mrs. Rebekah following: Now as for the rest of my real Estate my wife and devise is that it to be equally divided between my wife Sarah Brown and Martha Brown and Mary Brown and Lucy Elizabeth Brown my desire is that my wife Sarah Brown have the house and an equal share of land attached to it during her life and after her death to descend to my daugther to wit Martha Brown Mary Brown and Lucy E. Brown. Now my desire is that my wife Sarah Brown have and possess Possession of my Estate and I further nominate my Brother George W. Brown and Henry Brown my whole and sole Executors to this my last Will and testament revoking all former Wills hereby made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26 day of February 1839. Signed sealed and pronounced by me John S. Brown at my last Will and Testament in the presence of us who was present at the time signing and sealing hereunder

Brown of the County of Greenview State of Virginia late now in Wake Forest North Carolina being in a lost state of Health but of sound mind & memory do make this my last Will in manner and form following to wit, Item 1 My Will is that my Executor sell my three Negros, Shadrack, Peter and Rley together with all the rest of my Estate both real and personal in any manner he may think most convenient either privately or publicly Cash or Credit.

Item 2 My wife and devisee further is that my Executor apply a sum of the profits arising from the principal of my estate as may be necessary & needed for the support of my wife & children.

Item 3 Now my daughter arrives at lawful age or marriage then my wife to be equally divided between her and my wife but if my daughter should die in the mean time all that I have will'd to her is to go to her Mother to her & her heirs forever. And lastly I hereby appoint my friend Editha J. Potts of Northampton County, North Carolina to enter to this my last Will & Testament.
