Littleberry Long's Will. In the name of God amen I Littleberry Long of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of sound and disposing memory and knowing it appointed for all men to die do make & publish this my last will and testament. First of all my will & desire is that my Executor should pay out of my Estate the money I have engaged and contracted to pay for a fence and a parcel of Land from Allen Deberry as the said Contract specified and my just debts. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Segora Woman Master and her three children by the names of Jem, Mariah, and Charlotte and old Jem, to her and her heirs forever, and also my big house and gage Household and Kitchen furniture and all my Stock of Hogs Cattle and Sheep to her and her heirs. Thirdly I leave unto my beloved wife all the Land and plantations I have purchased & contracted for with Allen Deberry during his life or widowhood or until my son John L. Long comes of lawful age for the purpose of maintaining & schooling my children, free of any charge, and at her marriage if it should take place my will and desire is she should then be put to her one third of my said Lands. Fourthly my will and desire is that at the termination of either of the above mentioned periods of my wife's marriage or when my son comes of age my Land should be equally divided between my two children. Fifthly I leave unto my beloved wife my other two horses during her widowhood and at her marriage to be returned to my Estate in value as when she received them. Sixthly My will and desire is that the balance of my Estate of every description shall be equally divided between my two children John L. Long and Caroline L. Long to be equally divided between them share and share alike and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife Catherine my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. Henry Boon's Will. In the name of God amen I Henry Boon of the State of North Carolina and Northampton County being weak in body but thanks be to God of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament.
Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Boon the following property vizt one tract of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid near Smiths old Mill which I purchased of Joseph S. Smith also my four Wheel Carriage and harness my riding horse Strap at the back Cattle, Hogs, Horses and Sheep on the plantation whereon she now lives and also the crops of Corn fodder and Cotton the household & kitchen furniture of every description on said plantation and the following Negroes ^{my own slaves Allen & Phillis} that were formerly her, and also sheep, Ben formerly belonging to Jno. Branch, Hogg and Pinner and Maria and their increase to her and her heirs forever.
Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Temperance Brackley the following negroes vizt Eunna the wife Dilly and their two children, Liza and Mary, Abraham the wife Rachel, Patty and old Hannah with their increase to her and her heirs forever, to be taken away at the expiration of the year which I depart this life also the negroes given to my wife to be given up at the same time.
Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Temperance Brackley her just portion in my son Jock if he live to him and his heirs forever.
Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Boon the Land

and Plantation that formerly belonged to my Brother Thomas Boon when he arrives to the age of nineteen years before and he has given them 5th I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Boon the one half of the plantations at Story, running a straight line from the Creek House road to the first corner and the other half to my son James Laurence Boon to them and their heirs forever to be delivered when they arrive to the age of nineteen years -

Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Boon, Thomas Boon, Daniel Boon, and James L Boon all the balance of my negroes and their increase not already given away after paying my just debts, Mary Boon to be delivered when married or at the age of nineteen years also Thomas Boon, Daniel Boon and James L Boon to be given up when they arrive to the age of nineteen years to them and their heirs forever - My desire is that my river Land which I purchased of William M. Clark, John Green Henry, Papist be sold on a credit of six months or at the discretion of my Executor - and also all my Corn Crop and stock of every description at the Pyram Plantation on the River, also all my Corn Crop of every description kitchen furniture Plantation utensils at my plantation formerly belonging to my Brother Thomas Boon, also all my Crop of every description at the Story Hill plantation be sold on a credit of six months, Cotton excepted after leaving out one year's support of crops at Story Hill for the support of my first children, Mary, Thomas, Daniel and James L Boon and old negroes that not fit to hire - that is to say old Dany White, old Gunner White, old George White, old Jonas with such of the Women and children as want here for something to work here, then pay their debts here, then come to Cabot, four Sows pigs also I wish all my sheeps that is of sufficient age to be fattened out of my Crops of Corn and carried to market and be sold for Cash, also my Cotton Baid and sent to Petersburg to be sold for Cash - It is also my desire that my negroes remaining in a common stock, be hired out by the Year Labor unless as to be be shipped after receiving a sufficiency for my children and old negroes to continue at the Story Hill Plantation - It is also my desire that my machines and running gear, also my estate be sold on a credit of six months, and also the Land and plantation near Smiths old Mill be sold on a credit of six months if my Wife thinks proper to enter her claim to said Will -

I nominate and make James H Grant my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and testament as above stated

In the name of God Amen I William Maddy of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but in perfect sound mind and memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner hereinafter following that is to say - 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Maddy one negro Woman named Edy also one other Woman named Tilda one negro girl Caroline, one negro man named Witten one female slave by the name of Fy Two Bids Furniture three Cows to Cabot, four head of sheep two Sows pigs one York of Shores one Chick to her and her heirs forever - 2nd I lend to my said wife my Land and plantation whereon I now live two ploughs two Sows also one negro named Gary during her natural life - 3rd I give and bequeath to my Grand son Esai Maddy one female slave called Jack of Diamonds, one Bird and saddle one Blue Chest to him and his heirs forever - 4th I give and bequeath to my Grand son Witten Maddy one Bay mare called Feller, one Bridle and saddle one Coat Whistle one green Chest to him and his heirs forever - 5th I give and bequeath to my Grand son William Burns, one negro girl by the name of Mason to him and his heirs forever - 6th I give to my Grand son Anthony Burns one negro girl named Louisa also twenty Dollars to him and his heirs forever - 7th I give and bequeath to Humphrey Burns fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever - 8th I give and bequeath to my nephew William Maddy one negro male named Daniel also all my fowling moulds consisting of Powder, Plate, Lead, Musket, together with all that is therein belonging to him and his heirs forever -
