Littleberry Long's Will. In the name of God amen I, Littleberry Long of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of sound and disposing memory and knowing it appointed for all men to die do make & publish this my last will and testament First of all my will & desire is that my Executrix should pay out of my Estate the money I have engaged and contracted to pay for a place and a part of Land from Allen Debury as the said Contract specified and my just debts Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Negroe Woman Hester, and his three Children by the names of Jim, Mariah, and Charlotte and old Jim, to her and her heirs forever, and also my big house and gear Household and Kitchen furniture and all my Stock of Hogs Cattle and Sheep to her and her heirs Thirdly I send unto my beloved wife all the Lands and plantations I have purchased & contracted for with Allen Debury during his life or widowhood or until my son John L Long comes of full age for the purpose of maintaining & educating my children free of any charge, and at his marriage if it should take place my wife and daughter she should then be put to her one thirds of my said Lands Fourthly my will and desire is that at the termination of either of the above mentioned periods of my wife's marriage or when my son comes of age my land should be equally divided between my two children Fifthly I send unto my beloved wife my other two horses during his widowhood and at his marriage to be returned to my Estate in value as when she received them Sixthly My will and desire is that the balance of my Estate of every description shall be equally divided between my two children John L Long and Caroline E Long to be equally divided between them above and share alike and I do hereby nominate Constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Catherine my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament Given under my hand and seal this 26th day of February 1826

Henry Poore's Will. In the name of God amen I Henry Poore of the State of North Carolina and Northampton County being weak in body but thanks be to god of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Poore the following property vizt one tract of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid near Smith's old Mill which I purchased of Joseph D. Smith after my first White carriage and harness my riding horse Strap at the Stock Cattle Hogs Hens and Sheep on the plantation wherein she now lives and also the Crop of Corn fodder and Cotton the household & Kitchen furniture of every description on said plantation and the following negroes that were formerly her, and also Sophie, her formerly belonging to Dr. Branch A. Poore and Anna and Maria and their increase to her and her heirs forever Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Temperance Buckley the following negroes vizt Lewis his wife Dolly and their two children Lucy and Mary, Abraham, his wife Rachel, Patsy and old Hannah with their increase to her and her heirs forever to be taken away at the separation of the year which I depart this life also the negroes given to my wife to be given up at the same time

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Temperance Buckley her first born one as boy Jack of her lives to him and his heirs forever Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Poore the Land and

and Plantation that formerly belonged to my Brother Thomas Boon when he arrives to the age of Ninety years before his heirs receive it Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Boon the one half of the plantations at Stony, running a straight line from the Creek House road to the first corner and the other half to my son James Lawrence Boon to them and their heirs forever to be delivered when they arrive to the age of Ninety Years - Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Boon, Thomas Boon, Daniel Boon, and James L Boon all the balance of my negroes and their increase not already given away after paying my just debts. Mary Boons to be delivered when she arrives at the age of Ninety Years also Thomas Boon, Daniel Boon and James L Boon to be given up when they arrives to the age of Ninety Years to them and their heirs forever - My desire is that my river Land which I purchased of William H. Clark, John Green Henry, Pailette be sold on a credit of six months or at the discretion of my Executor. and also all my Corn Crop and Stock of every description at the Brynum Plantation on the River; also all my Corn Crop of every description Kitchen furniture Plantation utensils at my plantation formerly belonging to my Brother Thomas Boon. also all my Crop of every description at the Stony River plantation be sold on a credit of six Months. Cotton excepted after having out one years support of Crop at Stony River for the support of my four children, Mary, Thomas, Daniel and James L Boon and old negro that not fit to live - that is to say old Dary wife old Lummie wife, old George wife old Tom with such of the Women and children as work here for something her work her self then feather Bed furniture two Cows & calves, five Sows Spigs also Furs all my Sheets that is of sufficient size to be fatten out of my Crop of Corn and carried to market and be sold for Cash, also my Citter Bait and sent to Petersburg to be sold for Cash - It is also my desire that my negroes remaining in a common Stock, be hired out by the year Land unless also as to be shifted after receiving a sufficiency for my children and old negroes to cultivate at the Stony River Plantation - It is also my desire that my horses and riding gear, also my Sattel be sold on a credit of six Months. and also the Land and plantation near Smiths old Mill be sold on a credit of six Months if my wife thinks proper to make her desire to said Will - Promissory and make James H Grant my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and testament as above stated

In the name of God Amen I William Maddrey of the County of Southampton and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but in perfect sound mind and memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to do do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner before following that is to say - 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Maddrey one negro Woman named Edy also one other Woman named Tilda one negro girl Caroline, one negro man named Willie one Sowtale Mare by the name of Fly Two Black & Spurmetue three Cows & Calves, four head of Sheep two does Spigs one York of Sheep one Chick to her and her heirs forever - 2nd I tend to my said wife my Land and plantation wherein I now live this plough here & there & have also one negro named Gary during his natural life -

3rd I give also bequeath to my Grand son Silas Maddrey one Sowtale horse called Jack of Diamonds, one Bridle and Saddle on Blue Cloth to him and his heirs forever - 4th I give and bequeath to my Grand son Peter Maddrey one Bay mare called Filly, one Bridle and Saddle one Coat & Wheels one green Cloth to him and his heirs forever -

5th I give and bequeath to my Grand son William Burns, one negro girl by the name of Makon to him and his heirs forever - 6th I give to my Grand son Anthony Burns one negro girl named Louisa also twenty Dollars to him and his heirs forever -

7th I give and bequeath to Humphrey Burns fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever - 8th I give and bequeath to my nephew Stephen Maddrey one negro Man named Daniel also all my furniture movable consisting of Boxes, Glass & Diet Utensils together with all that is thereto belonging to him and his heirs forever -
