

William Mann's Will

I William Mann of County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory best of Considering the uncertainty of my earthly Existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

Item 1st. My Executors hereafter named shall provide for my Body a decent Burial suitable to the rank of plantation and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whosoever owing out of the Money that my first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my Estate -

Item 2^d. I give unto my beloved wife Winnie Mann all my Estate after paying all my just debts, during her natural life -

Item 3rd. At the death of my beloved wife Winnie Mann I give unto my grand daughter Nancy Bridges one feather Bed and furniture, one Plane Chest, and Glass Table, one Specimen Wheel & Cards, one Ladies Saddle, four Sitting Chairs, one pair of flat Irons, one Cow & Calf, one small Port & Horses, to her heirs for ever -

Item 4th. I give and bequeath unto Joseph Bridges one feather Bed & furniture, to him and his heirs for ever -

Item 5th. At the death of my beloved wife Winnie Mann it is my Will and desire for all my Estate not mentioned to equal division between my grand Children (Nancy, Harriet, Walter, Burgo, Bridges) to them and their heirs for ever -

Item 6th. And lastly I do nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Bridges my whole and sole Executrix to this my last Will and Testament - In witness I have hitherto set my hand and seal this 21st day of Sept 1844 - William Mann ^{his} mark

Attaway Brutton's Will

In the name of God Amen - Knowing that it is once appointed for all men to die - I Attaway Brutton of Northampton County NC being of sound mind and memory do make this writing to contain my Last Will and Testament revoking all others made heretofore by me -

Item 1st. I give unto my beloved wife Sally Brutton all of my Estate after paying all my just debts consisting of my Lands and plantation that I now live on with other tract, also two negroes Aseneth, Jeffrey and Sarah, also all my provisions now on hand all my stock of every kind at my Household and Kitchen furniture together with all my plantation utensils during her natural life or widowhood - My Will and desire is that my wife Sally Brutton shall have it in her power to make sale of any part of my Estate that she wishes to dispose of to raise a sufficient quantity of money to pay off all my just debts - Also it is my Will and desire that my wife Sally Brutton shall not settle any person on my Lands as long as she lives as I dont wish my Lands and Timbers destroyed by any other persons only by my own family &c -

Item 2^d. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary J. Murrell the sum of sixty five dollars being her full legacy of my Estate to be paid after the death or marriage of my wife Sally Brutton -

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath unto my son W. Brutton the sum of sixty five dollars being his full legacy of my Estate to be paid after the death or marriage of my wife Sally Brutton -

Item 4th. It is my Will and desire that at the Marriage or decease of my wife Sally Brutton that all the property that I have but her should be equally divided amongst my three sons and daughters

Children, namely Leucetia Wade, Salathia Chapman, Sally
Ann Britton, John W. Britton, Elizabeth J. Britton, Nathan J. Britton,
Joseph O. H. Britton, Henry J. Britton, Emily J. Britton.

Item 5th - My Will and desire is also that of my wife friends family
in possession of any property that I have left to her that is not prop-
erable to her and her children, she is at liberty to dispose of it
in any way that may be most beneficial to her and her above
mentioned Children. Also it is my Will and desire that
my wife have the privilege of using any of the above left prop-
erty in any that may seem most advantage to her and her
children above named so as not to prevent an equal division
amongst the above mentioned heirs.

Item 6th - I do hereby constitute make and ordain my friend
Kinchon Ponole Esq. to this my last Will and Testament -
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and forty one -

ESTATE GUMS' Will

I now all men by these presents that I Edew Gums of North-
ampton of Northampton and state of North Carolina do make
and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form as follows -

it to William Gums son of William M. Gums & Angelina
Gums daughter of Murphy Gums to be equally divided

heir or issue then in such case its my will that the Land

Gums have the use of all my Stock of all descriptions and all
of my Household and Kitchen furniture (except one Bed
and Furniture) to be held in trust for him by my Executor
whom I shall hereafter name -

Item 3d. I lend to my sister Leah Gums one Bed and furni-
ture her choice during her life and after her death I give
and bequeath unto William Gums son of William M. Gums
the said Bed & furniture for ever -

Item 4d. Lastly I nominate and appoint Shadrack Grady my
Executor to this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day
of September 1844 -
