 Children to wit, Mary Ann Murphy wife of Nicholas Murphy
 Thomas V. Roberts & Esther W. Roberts, to have & share alike
 equally, to them & their heirs forever. For the love & respect I have for Elizabeth
 Belatch, for her attention to my poor & distressed situation &
 for services rendered while living in my house, I give to her the sum
 of one hundred & fifty dollars, to be paid to her by my Executors here-
 after to be named.

My will & desire is that all the rest of my estate, may be sold and the money
 arising from such sale, (except the legacy I have given to Elizabeth Belatch, & as
 much as may be sufficient to support the old woman Rachel before men-
 tioned) may be equally divided between my three Grand Children as above men-
 tioned. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my two friends John Whittier & John
 R. Crook, Executors to this my last will & testament, In witness whereof I
