

James Book's Will. I James Book of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina do make my last will and testament in manner following to wit
 First I leave unto my wife Nancy Book during her natural life the following negroes George that come from my brother Thomas Book Nancy that come by her. Also Mary and their children Reb Lucy and Allen Charlotte Jane; also the sole use of the Land where I now live also Leas Wimber's tract of lands and the old place where I formerly lived also my rising shear and harrow also the Still and Cider Cask also two feather beds Furniture also two horses Terry and Nancy also a yoke of steers and Calf and whale tail Cow and pig first Calf two Cows and calves first calf two years and lambs first Calf also two acres and meadow-hire now granted her to one pair of iron wigs all her own choice also one year sufficient out of my crop and stock for her family.

Second - I give unto my son Henry Book the tract lands I purchased of Sarah D Bell also Sepo Lafayette tract where he now lives also Errol Lafayette tract of lands also their negroes Lucy, Betty and Albany with the wives with all the other property I have given him his heirs and assigns forever.

Thirdly I give down to my daughter Elizabeth Goodwin the following negroes Dick, Peter, Tom, & Ben son of Penny with their increase from the date hereof with all the other property I have given her and her heirs forever.

Fourthly I give and devise to my daughter Sarah Book Negro Charles, Estor, & Ben, being daughter of old Betty with their increase from the date hereof with all the other property I have given her and her heirs forever.

Fifthly I give and devise to my daughter Nancy Book the following negroes by Harry, Penny, Lucy, Lucy, Betty and Dick also one feather bed and furniture with their increase from the date hereof to her and her heirs forever.

Sixthly I give unto my son James Book the land I had of John F Vaughn also Nelly dog and tract also twenty acre of land I bought of Thomas Weston twenty acres being a part his part that fell to his wife also all the lands I have to my wife the dwelling house there of also their Negro Tom, Nelly, and Estor with their increase from the date hereof also one feather bed called his own also one feather bed Furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Seventhly It is my will and desire that all the negroes I have my wife be equally divided among my three daughters after the death of my wife Elizabeth Goodwin Sarah Book, Nancy Book to them I have and assigns forever.

Eighthly It is my further will and desire that all my property not made away of negroes and such like horses and my feed etc and funeral expenses be paid out of it and the balance of any be equally divided among all my children and I do nominate and appoint Willis Frizzell Executor of this my last will and testament with full confirmation that he will carry the same into Execution and hurly acknowledge the same to be my last will and in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the sixth June 1828.

John Edwards's Will. In the name of god amen I John Edwards of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being low in health but of a sound mind and memory, knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament by-

I give & bequeath unto my son Exum Edwards the sum of Lands adjoining his lands and bounded as follows beginning at a post oak standing in his line thence a line of marker to Silas Lafayette line thence along said line to the little swamp thence up said swamp a corner gun, to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Josiah Edwards the widow of my lands to wit the plantation where I now live also the liberty Trap and handy Still to take preference of the Still at years end to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Silas Edwards one negro boy named Bradley, him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Joanna Edwards one bed and furniture.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail Delilah Edwards one bed and furniture.

My will and desire is resolution of my property in doors and out and four negroes namely strike, Abby, Mary, Dudley, and Riddick to be sold my just debts to be paid and rest to be equally divided between my daughters Mary Edwards, Edgredine, Sally Vaughan, Rebecca Book, Joanna Edwards and Angel Delilah Edwards to them their heirs forever.

I appoint and ordain my son Silas Edwards and Exum Edwards executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 16th of May 1829

Carter Edmunds's Will. In the name of God amen
I Carter Edmunds being weak in body, but in my mind and disposing mind
and knowing that all men are to die do make and ordain this to be my last will
and testament -

First - I recommend my soul unto the hands of all merciful Creator and my body to be
decently interred - as to my worldly estate I do will and bequeath in the following
manner to wit -

Item 1st From the numerous services which my woman Hannah has rendered me it
is my will and desire that she and her three children be set free.

Item 2^d I do will and bequeath to the said Hannah Fifty acres of Land the line common
-ing at the lower corner of my yard next to the well running directly to a branch
thence up the branch a sufficient distance that the trees are shall be parallel
to the first line aforesaid It is my desire a good framed house eighteen by sixteen
feet be built upon said Lands, having two good floors, a brick chimney and
three eight light windows on such site as Hannah shall designate
I also desire that she have a garden cleared and fenced and a good well sunk in
the yards at the expense of my estate -

I give and bequeath to the above mentioned woman Hannah a negro woman
Kings and her increase to her and her heirs forever, also two cows, two Sons
are one years provision of Corn and Pork, in addition to the above legacies

I give and bequeath to the said Hannah Fifty Dollars annually to be paid out of
my estate, yearly I wish that Hannah and her three children Richard, Mary Jones and
Margaret Ann remain where they are upon my plantation and their expenses to be paid
out of my estate until my executors make the provisions I have provided for her.

Item 4th I do give and bequeath to my deceased brother Henry C. Edmunds' three children -
Carter, Rebecca and Eliza Edmunds Four thousand dollars to be equally divided
between them provided he nor she does not interfere with the settlement of this late
father's estate should either one do so I exclude him or her from any interest in my
estate, and I do give his or her portion to the other brother and sister or his two sisters
as the case may be.

Item 5th The residue of my estate of every kind and description whatever Bonds money &c
I give to my brother Nicholas Edmunds to dispose of in such manner as he may
see proper except my Watch which I give to my nephew Carter Edmunds

Item 6th My two boys Roger Miles and Henry the sons of my woman Lucy I wish the said
Nicholas Edmunds to bind out to some trade and to rear the people of them until
they arrive to Twenty four years of age, then to be set free should they find to be
handsome and well behaved servants.

Item 7th It is my will and desire should the law of Nth and N Carolina be found such
that the woman Hannah cannot remain in the generation of either Commonwealth
that my executors sell the Lands which her pay over to her the proceeds of the sale
of the Lands & pay the expenses of removing to such far State as she may choose
to go to out of my estate.

Item 8th I leave my brother Nicholas Edmunds my sole executor to this my last will
and testament -

Nathaniel T. Williams and Thomas J. Harper who stated that the signature to
said Codicil was in the proper hands writing of the said Carter Edmunds -
and that the said Will with the Codicil be certified and recorded -
Whereupon Nicholas Edmunds the Executor named in said will qualified
as the law directs.
