

Snow Wheeler's Will

In the Name of God Omnipotent I Snow Wheeler of the County of Northampton
and State of North Carolina being weak in body though of sound mind
and good understanding thanks be given to Almighty God for the same
do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in the following
manners & form. Viz.

First I give to my beloved Brother Joseph H. Wheeler three head of cattle,
1 Brandy Still, Wom & last five head of hogs to him & his heirs forever
also ninety three acres of land adjoining the lands of Samuels
Calvert brother to be divided equally between him & my Sister
Mary Wheeler and after her Marriage or death I give the same
ninety three acres to Joseph H. Wheeler & his heirs forever.

Second I give to Sarah M. Vaughan & James H. Wheeler three
head of cattle to be equally divided between them and their heirs
forever.

Third I give and bequeath to my Sister Mary Wheeler eight
heads of cattle 1 Bed and furniture, and a paral of feathers, 1 Bed
chest and 2 small trunks, also eleven heads of Geese, six head of
hogs to her & her heirs forever.

Fourth This my Will the my two remaining slaves shall be left
her also two yokes of Oxen for the use of the population.

Fifth His my wife, if I should have any money left after paying the
debts that may occur during my life, for the same to be equally divided
between Henry Wheeler & Mary Wheeler Joseph H. Wheeler & Daniel
Wheeler his, Wif Daniel Evans, Son & Dempsey Wheeler.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my Brother Joseph H. Wheeler my
only Executor to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
all former Wills & Testaments by me made, in witness whereunto
set my hand and seal the 9th day of March 1839.

In the Name of God Omnipotent I James Fenwell being weak in body but of
sound Mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament

all my Stock of hogs, cattle, horses & together with my house hold & kitchen
furniture Farming Utencils, tools & utensils and all Clarias deer bone
whatever nature and also all my other Property not herein named to her
use in natural life after paying all my just debts, and other debts
my Will and desire is that the above named Property be equally divided
between my five Children Miles Fenwell, Tom as Fenwell, James W. Fenwell
Nancy A. Fenwell and Little Lucy Fenwell; to them and their heirs forever.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 18th day
of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty
nine.
