 he arrived to lawful age or without a lawful child, in that case
 I give the said negro to my daughter Francis Thompson, and should
 she die without leaving a lawful heir of her body and in that
 case I give the said negro to my daughter Martha Thompson to
 her and her heirs forever. I give to all my children to wit
 James, James William, Martha & Francis Thompson all the balance
 of my estate of what sort soever it may be to them & their heirs forever
 I testify. I nominate & appoint my friend William D. Lockhart
 executor to this my said will. In Witness whereunto I have set
 my hand and seal this 5th day of August One thousand eight
 hundred and twenty five.

John Tennell's Will. In the name of god amen I John
 Tennell of the County of Northampton and state of North Carolina being
 of sound mind and memory, blessed be god, do make and ordain
 this to be my last will and testament in manner and form
 following that is to say.

Item I bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna two negro women named Esther
 and Dorah also the track of Land whereon I now live also my stock
 of all kinds, also my household and kitchen furniture & plantation
 utensils during her natural life and widowhood.

Item I give unto my four sons named James, William, Willie & Matthew
 a certain negro boy named Charles to be equally divided between

the four to them and their heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my two sons named James & Matthew the track of land
 whereon my father in law Matthew Parvate now lives to be equally
 divided between the two to them and their heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my two sons William & Willie the track of land whereon
 my mother now lives to be equally divided between the two to them
 and their heirs forever also my wife and decess is that my two sons
 William and Willie shall have thirty dollars each in money out
 of my estate to them and their heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my youngest son John D. Parvate the track of land whereon
 I now live to him and his heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my daughter Nancy one negro girl named Blinny to
 her and her heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth one negro girl named Sidney to
 her and her heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my daughter Parshaba one negro boy named Chat to her
 and her heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my daughter Lureny one negro boy named Daniel to her
 and her heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my daughter Prucilla one negro boy named Isaac to her
 and her heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my daughter Mary one negro girl named Hannah to
 her and her heirs forever.

also my wife and decess is after my wife decesses that the remaining
 part of my estate that I have not willed away shall be equally divided
 between my eleven children to wit named James, Nancy, Elizabeth,
 William, Willie, Parshaba, Lureny, Matthew, Prucilla, Mary an and
 John to them and their heirs forever all share and shares alike.
 And I do hereby ordain my worthy friend Sipe Woodard my wife
 and sole executor to this my last will and testament discharging all
 former wills hereby me made. In Witness whereunto I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this 18th day of October 1827.

James Exum's Will. In the name of god Amen
I James Exum of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina
do hereby make and publish this my last Will and Testament
as follows to wit:

First I give and bequeath unto my son William P. Evans the land and plantation, which I purchased of Hyder & Davie & wife together with about three hundred & twenty six acres to be taken from the tract I purchased of Newwood & Co. to be laid off as follows beginning at a gum in the little Cypress swamp, a corner between Ann's & the Davie tract as above and in a straight line with which divided the Davie tract and Ann's until it intersects with a line to be run from another part of the little Cypress swamp and make a branch a south east course, thence a line from the last mentioned part of the little Cypress swamp to the Oceaniche swamp so as to include all the houses &c. the whole supposed to contain about Eleven hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less and all the stock, Crops & plantation utensils which are or may be on the said Davie plantation and the following negro Slaves to wit, Piss Weckinson, Moses son: Lucy (wife of Moses) born, Nancy Malipa, Tatiana, Mary, Grace, Boston (Child of Nancy's), Morris Phillips, Sarah, Ransoph, Pia, Betty, Ben, Emory, Senney Shasrock, Caty & of Lucy's three children Sappery, Isaac, Calix, Isaway, Caty's two youngest Child: Senney daughter of Phillis Diera, three children, Franky, Cornmau, Lemmy, Hippy, & their future increase, to him his heirs and assigns forever, also one acre of Land more or less lying in the Oceaniche neck, reference to a Deed from Thomas Harget agent for William M. Jones will make it more fully appear to him his heirs assigns forever.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anne, the following

negroes to wit Henry, Charlotte, Lucy & her two children Dopy & Cecy of Charlotte, Therese & of Chiray, Cherry (wife of John) Boston, Washington, Solomon, Ben, John, Ann, Sucky, Isaac, Piscoy, Eldonia, Seddy, an Mopsy, Seddy & her children, Anwenster, Nitte & her son of Lady, Sarah, Sally & children, Abraham, Mariand, Annaliza, Peggy & child (Parasy & of Mogy, Allie, Annika, Rutitia, Golah, (Wells son of Lady) also the money arising from the sale of two negroes Peter & Hannah, as also the sum of three thousand dollars to be raised out of my Estate to her her heirs & assigns forever -

Kindly give to Robert H. Wilson all the money he owes me

I give and bequeath to my son James S. Hanson the plantation which I
 purchased of Henry & Matthew Baum together with about five hundred
 and fifty acres adjoining to be laid off as follows. Beginning at a Cypress
 a little below Amis' Mill chute, thence the mill race that leads to
 Cumps Mill to Noble's old field thence a straight line S. W. Course
 across the said old field to the little Cypress swamp thence down the
 said swamp, cornering with Harwood Dikes; thence with Dikes
 and Amis' line to Dancy's old store cornering at a red oak, thence
 a straight line to Cumps mill pond thence the various courses of the
 said Mill swamp to the first station the whole supposed to contain
 about One hundred and ^{cut} fifty acres be the same more or less
 and all the stock, plantation utensils which are or may be on the
 said plantations & the following negro slaves to wit, Lenny, Napier,
 Lottis, Lenny, the children George, Patsy, Abby, Catty, Cherry, Snow/flowering
 (Dof. Sally), Martha, Elizabeth, Molly & her children, Maddy, Lenny,
 Margaret, Dennis, Charlotte, David, Harp, Matthew, Lucretia (Patsy
 & children Raster & Tom) Selby, Minnie, Emmanuelle, Maki, Betty,
 Harrison, Samuell (son of Felix), Charles, Rob. & their families
 inure also to him his heirs & assigns forever - only one old negro man that

Fifthly The residue of my negroes and other estate I desire may be kept together in common until my son Joseph S. Exum arrives at twenty one years of age or marries, at which time the negroes stock, crop, and plantation tenements which may be on hand to be divided between my said son Joseph S. Exum and my wife Ann, when ever such a division should take place it is my wish my son Joseph S. Exum draw out of the negroes remaining in common as many as either of my sons before mentioned might have had given them in this
