Taylor the other subscribing witness to said will and the signature of said William A. Taylor to appeared is in his proper hand writing and that the said witness here in the State of Alabama and at the same time Richard Williams Sr. and William C. Richards and being duly sworn made oath that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of Richard Crump deceased and that the name and signature appeared to said paper writing is of the proper hand writing of the said Richard Crump whereupon it is ordered that said paper writing be admitted to probate as the last will and testament of Richard Crump (deceased) and that the same be recorded & although not attested by the Court of Wills & Quarter Sessions of Northampton County North Carolina according to law. William Fox's Will In the name of God Amen

I William Fox of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina being in my usual health of sound & perfect mind & memory Blessed be God do this seventeenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred & thirty two make & publish this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say.

- 1- It is my will & desire that all my just debts be paid.
- 2- It is my will & desire that my beloved wife Mary Fox shall have such part of my property as she shall be entitled to in the State of Virginia & the State of North Carolina agreeable to the laws of both States.
- 3- It is my will & desire that my son George T. Fox shall not receive any further part of my Estate more than what I have already given him which is his proportional part.
- 4- It is my will & desire that my Daughter Rebecca B. Woodruff shall not receive any further part of my Estate more than what I have already given her which is her proportional part.
- 5- I give & bequeath to my son William C. Fox all of my land lying in the State of North Carolina & Virginia that lies above Cross branch to him his heirs and assigns forever.
- 6- I give & bequeath to my Daughter Frances H. Fox all my land lying in the State of North Carolina & State of Virginia below Cross branch & adjoining the Halifax road to her her heirs & assigns forever.
- 7- It is my will & desire that all of my Estate of every description that is deemed mine both real & personal not yett ready given is equally divided between my son William C. Fox & Frances H. Fox shares & shares alike to them their heirs & assigns forever.

And I hereby make & ratify my Friend William Moody Long as William C. Fox's Executor of this my last will & Testament - working all others withy made by me In witness whereof I the said William Fox have to this my last will & Testament - set my hand & Seal.
