

Enos Tuttle Will

In the name of god amen I Enos Tuttle of the county of Washington being weak of body but of sound senses memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed of god for all flesh to die do make and deliver this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (Viz)

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Tuttle all the property she was possessed of previous to my marriage with her. Also five barrels Corn five hundred pounds pork and One hundred dollars in Cash Also I leave unto my beloved wife Nancy Tuttle all that part of my plantation where I now live lying on the south side of the road leading from the office of the bridge to Spence mill Also my three negroes Bessie Lida and Lila during her natural life or widowhood and no longer.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Tuttle One dollar in Cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Tuttle two Bonds which I hold against him amounting to five hundred dollars together with the interest thereon to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Matson wife of Martin Matson Two hundred dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Eliza Windsor wife of Joseph Windsor one hundred and Eighty dollars in Cash and one Feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abby Tuttle wife of Leith Tuttle one bond which I hold against her husband Leith Tuttle to the amount of Five hundred dollars together with the interest thereon to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Tuttle the land and plantation where I first settled called the Old place Also two tracts of land which I purchased of James Oliver In Also one tract of land which fell to my Elizabeth by the death of her father John Tuttle Also my four negroes (to wit) Edy Joseph Ben and George Also my bay horse Bridle and saddle now of my son James Tuttle shall

die without an heir lawfully begotten of her body my will and desire is that all the property that I have given him be equally divided between my son James Tuttle and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Elias Tuttle the land and plantation and mill which I purchased of Solomon Wither Also my four negroes Lida green Kate and Mason Also my land now and if my son Elias shall die without an heir lawfully begotten of his body my will and desire is that all the property that I have given him be equally divided between my two sons James Tuttle and Solomon Tuttle to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Solomon Tuttle the land and plantation where I now live at my wife's death Also my four negroes (to wit) Billy Charity Dick and Spurick and three hundred dollars in Cash now if my son Solomon Tuttle shall die without an heir lawfully begotten of his body my will and desire is that all the property that I have given him be equally divided between my two sons James and Elias Tuttle to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Catharine Tuttle the land and plantation which I purchased of John Fennell and my negro Lila at her mother's death Also one hundred dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item My will and desire is that all my property not here before given away be sold by my Executors and the money arising from the sale of same together with all the money and bonds which may be found at my death be applied to the payment of the Legacies which I have given in Cash and all the remainder if any be equally divided between my three sons James Elias and Solomon Tuttle to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I do recommend my good and faithful friend Thomas Soyner to whole and sole Executor to this my last will and Testament. Revoking and disannulling all wills heretofore by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 10 day of October 1838.

John Cohen Will

In the name of god amen, I John Cohen of the County of Northampton, New Hampshire, being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing mind, and memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows, first calling to mind the mortality of man that it is appointed to man to die, I commend the soul to god who gave me hope of a joyful resurrection of the same and a few worldly goods it has pleased god to bless me with as follows in the following manner (to wit)

- Item 1. I leave to my wife Nancy Cohen during her life that part of my land I now live on to begin at the back of the lot near the Head of the ice path down said path to the Halfot road thence along said road south to Presummit thence said Persons line to an old path thence a direction to the rail road so as to include the Mauden Green thence along said road south so as to include the open land about my house thence a straight line to the beginning. I also leave her until my youngest child comes to the age of twenty one year three bedsteads beds & furniture of her own choice one Cart & Wheels so and give two spinning wheels & two pair Cards and those to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my four youngest children
- Item 2. I leave to the Purse of my wife Nancy for the benefit of my four youngest children herself two negroes Stephen & Rachael and one horse called Redbird and if these negroes should become disabled for them to be supported out of the money belonging to my estate
- Item 3. I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy two negroes Robert & Emanuel & their future increase one Warren & his wife one Bedstead & Bed & furniture her own choice one Cart & Calf & one cow & pigs all of her own choice

- then I send dollars and her mother with good provision for her and my four youngest children to her and her heirs forever
- Item 4. I give and bequeath to my son John & to his heirs the tract of land he now lives on and two negroes named Amy to him and his heirs forever
- Item 5. I give and bequeath to my daughter Deborah Haines two negroes Abner besides what I have already given her to her and her heirs forever
- Item 6. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally & her three negroes Harry, Liddah & girl Betty and their future increase to her and her heirs forever
- Item 7. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth & her three negroes Sampson, Chantel her youngest child and their future increase to her and her heirs forever
- Item 8. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah & her three negroes Susan besides what I have already given her to her and her heirs forever
- Item 9. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Cohen one hundred dollars and that I pay her ten dollars a year until the whole is paid her to her and her heirs forever
- Item 10. I give and bequeath to my daughter Frances Cohen one hundred dollars and that I pay her ten dollars a year until the whole is paid her to her and her heirs forever
- Item 11. I leave to James Mark the tract of land he now lives on called Egypt during his life I also leave him four negroes which he has in possession Stephen, Amy, Lydiah & Abner until my grandson John Mark arrives to the age of twenty one year and then for him to have them
- Item 12. I give to James Mark all the balance of the purchase property which he has in possession which I have added in full for the land and his heirs forever
- Item 13. I give and bequeath to my grandson John & Mark the tract of land called ground the four negroes named the father where he becomes of age naming Stephen, Amy, Lydiah & Abner & their future increase and the tract of land called Egypt out of father's death to him and his heirs forever
- Item 14. I give and bequeath to my four youngest children namely Thomas, Richard, C. Joseph, & William & John all my land that I own here and that I have any interest in also the land I have to my wife at
