

William Stephenson's Will

In the name of God amen I William Stephenson of the county of Northampton and State of North Carolina being sick but in perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this instrument my last will and testament.

- Item 1st I command my soul and body into the hands of God who gave them
- Item 2^d I bind unto my wife Martha Stephenson her natural life the following property (to wch) one negro man Jim one negro woman Ellie one other woman Deborah one boy Alfred one small girl Aggy one small boy Ben, one bay mare, and her choice one of the balance of my horses, one cow & calf one hundred hogs— and one white yearling— ten cows and pigs her choice at the first towards Henry's then feather beds furniture with all my household and kitchen furniture, one heavy wagon and barrel, one cart & wheels one loom and gear and a year's provision. It is my will and desire at the death of my wife that all of the above named property except the above named negroes should be equally divided between all my children namely Patrick A Stephenson, Rebecca Weston, Margaret Stephenson, Nicanor T Stephenson and John W Stephenson to them & their heirs forever
- Item 3rd I give unto my son Patrick A Stephenson one negro woman Rachel also one negro boy Alfred at the death of my wife to him & his heirs forever
- Item 4th I give unto my daughter Rebecca Weston one negro girl Patience also one negro woman Hannah at the death of my wife to her and her heirs forever
- Item 5th I give unto my daughter Margaret Stephenson one negro man Shadrack also one negro girl Aggy at the death of my wife to her and her heirs forever
- Item 6th I give unto my son Nicanor T Stephenson one negro man Poach also one negro boy Ben at the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever
- Item 7th I give unto my son John W Stephenson one negro man Tom and a negro girl Ellie at the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever
- Item 8th I bind unto my wife Martha Stephenson her natural life on third part of my lands including the house wherein I live & Cotton gin and scows, the balance of my lands I give unto my son John W Stephenson including the house where he lives, and at the death of my wife. It is my will and desire that he should have and possess all the lands wherein I live and the Cotton gin & scows to him and his heirs forever
- Item 9th I do make and appoint my sons Nicanor T Stephenson and John W Stephenson my whole and sole executors to this my last will and testament— In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 15th day of April AD One thousand

eight hundred and thirty seven.

Levi Fugerson's Will

In the name of God amen I Levi Fugerson of the county of Northampton and State of North Carolina do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament, revoking all other wills heretofore made by me

- 1st It is my will and desire that all my just debt shall be paid by my executors out of my estate—
- 2nd My will is that my executors sell all my land lying on the south side of the road which runs through my plantation except the orchard and that the same run out side of the fence which incloses the orchard.
- 3rd I bind unto my wife Margaret Fugerson all my land and plantation wherein I now live and which lies on the North side of the same road— with all moneys bonds and accounts which I have all my household and kitchen furniture of every kind all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep, and hogs all my crop of corn fodder and oats plantation utensils of every kind & all the rest of my estate if any that is not named, until my youngest son arrives to the age of fourteen years for the purpose of raising clothing and schooling my three sons Willis A Fugerson, Peter L Fugerson & Lettston J L Fugerson and when my youngest son arrives to the age of fourteen years, that my wife shall be equally divided and that my wife take one fourth part in fee simple and each of my sons one fourth part of the balance to them and their heirs forever but it is not my will that they take immediate possession of their property but may choose or have guardians appointed for them until they arrive to lawful age
- 4th I nominate and appoint my wife my whole and sole executrix to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my

hand and seal this twenty seconds day of June 1837

Thomas Garner's Will.

In the name of God ameu I Thomas Garner of the County of Northampton and State of N Carolina knowing it appinted unto me now to do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following to wit.

Item 1^o It is my will & desire that my brother Bradford Garner shall have my half of a fishing place called & known as the high Islands fishing place in Roanoke River or Bradfords falls - also my shot gun which he is to take possession at my decease.

Item 2^o It is my will and desire that my wife Nancy Garner shall have the pector of her fathers estate which is due me in right of her also my Cow & calf and sow and sheats to her her herd & all goats forever.

Item 3^o It is further my will and desire that my wife Nancy Garner shall have the tract of land called the shorewood ^{laid} in trust to me by my uncle Mr Garner at the death of my father during her natural life or widowhood and if she die without an heir by me begotten it is then my wish that my brother Bradfords Garner should have the said land.

Item 4^o It is my will & desire that my excutor hereafter appointed shall sell my crop of Cotton now on hand and together with what money I have by me pay all my just debts and retain the remainder if any in his hands for the benefit of my said wife Nancy Garner as she may need it.

Item 5^o It is my will that my wife Nancy Garner shall have all the rest of my estate which I have not disposed of during her natural life or widowhood & if she die without a lawful heir by me begotten it is then & in that case my will and desire that my brother Bradford Garner shall have it.

Item 6^o And lastly I do hereby appoint David W. Matthews Executor to

this my last will & testament revoking by this all other wills hertofore by me made In writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23rd day of March 1837

Merritt L W King's Will.

In the name of God ameu I Merritt L W King of the county of Northampton and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament for the disposal of such worldly goods as I have placed abeghtly God to bestow upon me

Item I give to my sister Tempery all my stock of horses Cattle Hogs household & Kitchen furniture of every description together with all my plantation tools & utensils with my present stock of provisions together with the Crops now on the ground to her and her heirs forever - Item I bind to my Item I stand with my sister Tempery Uncle Dabney Cawthon and his wife Sarah Cawthon during their lifetimes for them to have a comfortable home so long as they may live the tract of land wherein I now live -

Item After the death of my said sister Tempery Uncle Dabney Cawthon and his wife Sarah I give to the youngest surviving daughter of my said Uncle Dabney Cawthon and his wife Sarah my tract of lands and the two negroes above mentioned to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my sister Tempery and her heirs forever my crop of Cotton now on hand and all the debts owing to me and all other species of property that I own after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses -

It is my will & desire that there by no inventory or sale I hereby nominate and appoint my sister Tempery Cawthon of this my last will and testament to write up whereof I have hingered set my hand & seal this first day of May one thousand eight hundred
