

# Codicil

I desire that all of the negroes before mentioned that are left to be sold instead of credit must be sold for cash down and as soon as the money that is raised out of my estate to be paid over to the Legatees as soon as collected.

The tract of which I purchased of Edward Nolley and others lying on Roanoke River containing one hundred forty acres & a half known by the name of the Bell tract I desire to be sold to the best advantage and to be given to my dearest sister Mary, children except Bennet Young for whom I make no provision concerning said Land &c.

**John B. Glover's Will** In the name of God Amen I John Glover of the County of Northampton in State of North Carolina do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit First I give to my Daughter Eliza Glover one feather bed and furniture--

Secondly I give to my son Seth P. Glover one horse saddle & bridle worth one hundred and fifty dollars-- Thirdly I leave to my beloved wife Mary Glover in sum of Seven all the rest of my Estate of every nature and kind whatever during her natural life and it is to pay all of my just debts and losses and clothes and school all my Children will until they arrive of Lawful age Except my daughter Eliza Glover and my son

Seth P. Glover-

Fourthly I give all the aforesaid property I owned to my wife to be equally divided at her death between my Daughters Eliza Glover Mary Glover and my sons John Glover and Jones Glover --

Fifthly It is my Will and desire that if either my Daughters or the Glover slaves or my sons John Glover or Jones Glover should arrive of Lawfull age before the Death of my Wife Mary Glover then and in that case they are to receive the one half of what would be their share at the death of my said Wife --

Lastly I nominate and appoint my friend Richard W. Leeks

Executor to this my Last will and Testament revoking all other Wills

**Dorothy Perry Will** In the name of God Amen I Dorothy Perry of the County of Northampton and State of N. Carolina being of sound mind and memory do this 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1833 do make & execute this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows to wit First I give unto my daughter Charlotte Leaven Seven negroes namely Charlotte, Fagge, Snow, Cherry, Hillifer, Danier, & free one bed and furniture and Chest & side saddle to her and her heirs for ever said. I give unto my daughter Phady Thomas six negroes namely as follows. Mason, Lester, George, Simon, David & Lucy, one bed furniture to her and her heirs for ever. This I give unto my daughter Millie Bostick the following negroes Daniel, Charity, Hale, Mary, Lydia, Job & Wm. and bed and furniture to one gray mare to her and her heirs for ever
