 following negroes to wit. one negro woman named Fanny two negro boys
 named Anderson & Ben two negro girls named Cherry and Abby with
 all their future increase to him and his heirs forever -

Item After the death of my wife my will and desire is that all my entire
 both personal and personal not especially given and bequeathed be
 equally divided between my grand daughter Mary Gladish my grand-
 son John Glover Jr. & my sons John Glover Sr. Nathaniel Glover &
 Alexander Glover to share alike -

Item Lastly I nominate and appoint John Glover and Alexander Glover

Executors to this my last Will and testament, In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the eighteenth day of June

William T. Exum's Will. In the name of god amen I

William T. Exum of Northampton County State of North Carolina being weak
in body but of sound disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this
as my last will and testament in manner following: to wit -

- First, I leave to my sister Hannah Wilson during her life all my land & plantation
lying between the Wakefor road and the Occanoke swamp, and on the south side
of said road: with the privilege of getting timber for the use of said plantation
from my land lying on the north side of said road.
- Second, I give and bequeath to my said sister Hannah Wilson Ten negroes to her, her
heirs and assigns forever.
- Third, I give and bequeath to my brother James T. Exum and Joseph T. Exum the land
and plantation on the north side of the Wakefor road: and at the death of my
said sister Hannah Wilson. I also give and bequeath to my said brother, the land
and plantation I leave to my said sister, or to the survivors of them, in case either
should die before my said sister, to them, or him, thus or his heirs or assigns forever.
- Fourth, I give and bequeath, to my said brother James T. and Joseph T. Exum the
balance of my negroes after taking out the ten negroes given and bequeathed
to my sister Hannah Wilson to them their heirs and assigns forever.
- Fifth, I give and bequeath to my mother all my household furniture, including beds
and I leave to her my fold watch and appendages during her life, and at
her death I give and bequeath the said watch to my brother Joseph T. Exum.
- Sixth, It is my wish and desire that the residue of my Estate of whatever kind
or nature, be sold at the discretion of my Executors, hereinafter named
and the proceeds of such sale, after paying my debts I give and bequeath
to my mother.
- Seventh, I name and appoint my friend William B. Lockhart and my

brother James T. Exum, Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby
revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.
