In the name of God Amen, I Buckner Williams of the County of Northampton and State of N. C. Carolina being in a low & infirm State of health but of sound & disposing mind before God, do make and ordain this my last will & Testament Vizt

Item 1st I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Williams all my property now in my possession and not heretofore given away by Deed or gift Vizt the following negroes, to wit, Ned, Harry & Saak. Household furniture Stock of every description Day Wares, cattle & things all my provisions on hand together with every article & description of property to her & her heirs and assigns forever.

Item 2nd I further give and bequeath unto my said wife Mary Williams all debts now due me, after paying my just debts,

Item 3rd I nominate and appoint Daniel B. Boykin Executrix of this my last will and Testament Given under my hand sealed this 15th day January in year of Lord 1836. his

Norman Branch's Will

In the name of God Amen, Norman Branch of the County of Northampton in the State of N. C. Carolina being, in perfect sense & sound memory & understanding, thanks be to almighty God for the same & calling to mind the certainty of death do make & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form as follows. Item I give unto my beloved wife Christian Branch all my negroes. Dixie, Sneed & Thomas & Missy & Ben & William & Little Ben & Winney & Sally & Easter Miller & Mose & Master & Elizabeth & Abby & Lucy & all my large & my Stock of all Birds & fowls & hens & Chicks of whatever kind after Paying all my just debts & all my Expenses of this my last will & Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal 28th September 1830.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that the said paper writing purporting to be the last will & Testament of the said deceased Branch and his executors & administrators in accordance with the will annexed and the Estate of said R. Branch and his daughter Christian Branch & wife & John R. Branch & his son & his children with their executors & administrators & the law directs thereon the said Christian qualified as a test. with the will annexed of the said deceased Branch executed according to law.

Simpson Grant's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Simpson Grant of Northampton County being weak in Body but of sound mind & memory do make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner & form following:

First, my Will & desire is that a certain Negro Girl, that I had from my Hesters Estate by the name of Rosalie if she should die should be kept & supported with all her increase by my son John C. Grant & James B. Grant & Esther Grant & Wesley Grant or the surviving part of them until such time as said Negroe girl increase shall be divided in four shares. Then my desire is that one fourth part of said Negro already before named, Should go to my Grandsons Children one fourth to my son James Children, one fourth to Esther & one fourth to Wesley & if either of my children Should die before me division can take place that said negro girl increase Should go to their heirs if any or the surviving part of them, as the true intention is that they Should be kept in the family.

Second, I do hereby appoint my son James B. Grant executor to this my last will & Testament in writing, her of I have hereto set my hand & seal this sixth day of July, thousand & thirty four in the presence of
