William S. Grant's Will

In the name of God Amen I Wm. S. Grant of the County of Northampton
& State of North Carolina do make & ordain this my last will & Testament
as follows, to wit;

1st I give & bequeath unto my beloved nephew James Grant Odum, the
following negroes, to wit, John, Mary, Rachab, Sarah Lane,
Melina, Mary & James & their increase, also one half of my land
lying on the South West side of the Road leading from Bryants Cross
Road to Bowns Cross Roads & on both sides of the Road leading
from Bowns Cross Roads to Judgers ferry. I unite him the said
his heirs & assigns forever,

Secondly, I give & bequeath unto my friend Geo. B. Odum, all the balance
of my property after paying my just debts, consisting of negro
property, stock of all descriptions, crop, farming utensils,
household, Kitchen furniture, and household, &c. also all the balance of
my land and all my remaining rights &c. I unite him the said Geo. B. Odum his heirs
& assigns forever

Thirdly I hereby nominate & appoint my friend Geo. B. Odum sole executor
to this my last will & Testament, also leave him to manage the
estate herein bequeathed unto Geo. B. Odum until he arrives to majority
age. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
12th day Nov. A. D. 1860.
