Item I give and bequeath unto the said Sally Harris one feather bed and furniture to lie
and her four

It is my will and desire that the balance of my property should be sold to pay my
just debts and the balance of money if any to go to the said Sally Harris in her
fours - I do nominate and chuse John & Maggie my sole Executrix to this my last
will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this

and Tom, one hundred and twenty barrels corn, pig and hams, on half of the
farming utensils together with all the household and kitchen furniture except one
bed furniture and half a dozen Windsor chairs to her and her heirs forever

Third I give to Anna Sutt one Negroe girl George to her and her heirs forever
Fourth I give to John Phillips the son of Henry Phillips after paying my just debts

Cesar, Marguerite & Ambros, also the plantation known by the name of the Old
place wherein William Hart now resides adjoining the Land of William Bottoms

the lands I own reside on and at the death of my wife the other half together with
all the balance of my estate not before given away to him and his heirs forever

Benjamin, Martha Cullen, Elizabeth & Sally. I also appoint Andrew A. Crum to
Cullen Crum executors to this my last will and testament, given under my hand
