In the name of God Amen, I Esther Roberts of the County of Northampton
 and State of Massachusetts, being of lawful age and disposing mind & memory
 do make & declare this writing to be my last will & testament, in manner
 & form following, to wit:

I give & bequeath unto my Grand son Thomas
 V. Roberts, one bed & furniture & one Gray Horse called Little Boy
 to him & his heirs forever. I give & bequeath unto my Grand daughter
 Esther W. Roberts, one bed & furniture & all my silver spoons back table
 & two spoons to her and her heirs forever.

My will & desire is that my old negro man Sam, and my old negro woman
 Biddy may have their freedom, and that my old negro woman Rachel
 may be comfortably supported during her life time out of the
 money arising from the sales of my estate. My will & desire is
 that the balance of my negroes to wit, Isaac, Willis, Anthony
 & Miles, may be equally divided between my three Grand
 Children to wit, Mary Ann Murphy wife of Nicholas Murphy
 Thomas V. Roberts & Esther W. Roberts, to have & share alike
 equally, to them & their heirs forever. For the love & respect I have for Elizabeth
 DeLoach, after her attention to my poor distressed situation &
 for services rendered while living in my house, I give to her the sum
 of one hundred & fifty dollars, to be paid to her by my executors here-
 after to be named.

My will & desire is that all the rest of my estate, may be sold and the money
 arising from such sale, (except the legacy I have given to Elizabeth DeLoach, & as
 much as may be sufficient to support the old woman Rachel before men-
 tioned) may be equally divided between my three Grand Children as above men-
 tioned. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my two friends John Whittier & John
 R. Crook, Executors to this my last will & testament, In witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day of July 1833.

Mary D Hart's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Mary D Hart of the County of Northampton
 and State of Massachusetts, being dead and true in body, but of sound & disposing
 mind, and memory, do make, and ordain, this my last will & testament,
 revoking all other wills heretofore made by me, in manner and form fol-
 lowing, to wit:

I give and bequeath unto Sam Bottom one parrot & bed and furniture
 I give & bequeath unto John D. Phillips, William Phillips, and James
 Sam Hart, the residue of my estate real and personal (after paying
 all my just debts, and the debts of my deceased husband) to be equally
 & divided between them; but in case Mary Sam Hart dies before
