In the name of God Amen, I Esther Roberts of the County of Northampton
 and State of North Carolina, being of lawful age and disposing mind & memory
 do make & ordain this writing to be my last will & testament, in manner
 & form following, to wit:

I give & bequeath unto my Grand son Thomas
 V. Roberts, one bed & furniture & one Gray Horse called Little Boy
 to him & his heirs forever. I give & bequeath unto my Grand daughter
 Esther W. Roberts, one bed & furniture & all my silver spoons back table
 & two spoons to her and her heirs forever.

My will & desire is that my old negro man Sam, and my old negro woman
 Betty may have their freedom, and that my old negro woman Rachel
 may be comfortably supported during her life time out of the
 money arising from the sales of my estate. My will & desire is
 that the balance of my negroes to wit, Isaac, Willis, Anthony
 & Miles, may be equally divided between my three Grand
 Children to wit, Mary Ann Murphy wife of Nicholas Murphy
 Thomas V. Roberts & Esther W. Roberts, to have & share alike
 equally, to them & their heirs forever. For the love & respect I have for Elizabeth
 DeLoach, after her attention to my poor distressed situation &
 for services rendered while living in my house, I give to her the sum
 of one hundred & fifty dollars, to be paid to her by my executors here-
 after to be named.

My will & desire is that all the rest of my estate, may be sold and the money
 arising from such sale, (except the legacy I have given to Elizabeth DeLoach, & as
 much as may be sufficient to support the old woman Rachel before men-
 tioned) may be equally divided between my three Grand Children as above men-
 tioned. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my two friends John Whitley & John
 R. Crook, Executors to this my last will & testament, In witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day of July 1833.

Mary D Hart's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Mary D Hart of the County of Northampton
 and State of North Carolina, being dead and true in body, but of sound & disposing
 mind, and memory, do make, and ordain, this my last will & testament,
 revoking all other wills heretofore made by me, in manner and form fol-
 lowing, to wit:

I give and bequeath unto Sam Bottom one parrot & bed and furniture
 I give & bequeath unto John D. Phillips, William Phillips, and James
 Sam Hart, the residue of my estate real and personal (after paying
 all my just debts, and the debts of my deceased husband) to be equally
 & divided between them; but in case Mary Sam Hart dies before
 she arrives at lawful age or has lawful issue then, and in that case,
 I give and bequeath her portion of my estate to John D. Phillips, and
 William Phillips, to be equally divided to them & their heirs forever.

In the name of God Amen, I Lillian Hyslop of the County of Northampton
 and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and perfect

 purchase a plantation with my money and little husband thereon, which
 plantation she is to use as her own property except in case of her decease,
 in which case the said plantation is to be sold and the money arising
 from such sale to be equally divided amongst my children, and that
 my wife Martha R. Hyslop, shall have three hundred dollars to be
 paid her out of my estate.

It also is my will & desire that my dear wife Elizabeth shall have the use of all my estate & earnings of my negroes for the support & interest of herself and my children during her life & to use as she may think proper if it should be to the selling of one or more of my negroes that she have full power to do so and to make a full right title for the same but in case of her marriage by so doing she is to forfeit all right and title to any part of my estate except the three hundred dollars before mentioned Third and Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife Martha R. Hyatt my lawful executor of this my last will & Testament In Confirmation hereof I Subscribed Hyatt the Testator have unto them presents let my hand & Seal this third day of Decr in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four

Jane Turners Will

In the name of God Amen. I Jane Turner of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being aware & being of sound & disposing mind and memory do make certain public and declare this to be my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say

First

my will & desire is that my negro man Peter Anthony and Jacob be sold to such person or persons as they may choose as much provided such person or persons will give a fair price for them the same to be determined by my Executors herein after named. & the sale to be made by them and the money arising from such sale or sales to be applied by my said Exec as herein after directed.

Then

I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Spier my said metal Skillet and all my Salys and Harrows to her & her heirs forever and I also give her fifty dollars provided she continues with me and takes care of me during my life and not otherwise

Then

I give and bequeath unto Robert Spier my said one head of furniture and one cow & calf to her & her heirs forever

Then

I give & bequeath unto my negroes Harry Peter Anthony & Jacob the sum of four dollars each to be paid to them by my said Exec and I also give unto my negro woman Lybil my said skin trunk

Then

I give unto my nephew Callen H Barnes the following negroes (Mabel, Hardy, Gehny, Lybil, Nancy Lizza, Austin, Jack Daniel, Peggy, Minny, Tom, Elah, & Caroline them & their future increase to him & his heirs forever and I also give unto him the money arising from the sale of my negro man Peter in like manner.

Then

It is my will & desire that my niece Elizabeth shall be permitted by my Exec to be let any part or the whole of my household furniture which I have not disposed of which I give to her & her heirs forever the residue of any to be sold and the money arising therefrom to be applied as herein after directed

Then

my will & desire is that the whole of the residue of my estate of my kind or description not aforesaid away be sold by my Executors and after paying the legacies mentioned and all my just debts of every description the balance of the same together with the money arising from the sale of my two negroes Anthony & Jacob I leave unto my niece Elizabeth Ward the widow of William Ward and during her natural life and it is further my desire that the said Elizabeth Ward be at liberty to lay out the money so be to her for such negroes as she may think proper or any part thereof and at the death of my said niece I give to her surviving children all such negroes and their increase together with the surplus of money if any there be remaining which has not been disposed of for negroes as before directed to be equally divided between such surviving children or as near to them their heirs forever

and Lastly I do by these presents constitute and appoint my friend Nathaniel

Stephens and my nephew Callen H Barnes my whole & sole Executors Respecting all other wills by me heretofore made & declaring this to be my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set at my hand & affixed my seal this 24 day of Jan'y 1831.
