

Item 3<sup>o</sup> I give and bequeath unto Rowson Pope supposed to be as above, the sum of one dollar to him and his heirs forever

Item 3<sup>o</sup> I give and bequeath unto Lewis Pope supposed to be as above the sum of one dollar to him and his heirs forever

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto Rebecca Pope supposed to be daughter as above the sum of one dollar to her and her heirs forever

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my little Patience Fentress two Feather Beds and furniture (which I have used this time in the case and at the residence of Henry Putten) to her and her heirs forever, also all my working Tools which are in the care of John Putten, I give and bequeath unto her the S<sup>o</sup> Patience Fentress and her heirs forever also some kind of Stock (at Charley Crocker) to her and her heirs forever

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my two sons Boy and Stephen Pope one certain Truck or Parcel of Land containing by estimation more or less one hundred and nine acres to be equally divided between them the S<sup>o</sup> Boy and Stephen Pope, provided they should return to this County and apply for the same, to them and their heirs forever but if they or their heirs should not come forward or otherwise apply for the same I then bequeath the same to my sister Patience Fentress and her heirs forever, the same Land being at this time in the possession of Nathaniel Allen

Item 7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my S<sup>o</sup> sister Patience Fentress the sum of thirty five dollars in Money (which is at this time in the hands of attorney Henry Putten) to her and her heirs forever also all my other Money due in Bond or open A/c. I also give and bequeath unto her the S<sup>o</sup> Patience Fentress and her heirs forever

Item 8<sup>th</sup> I also give and bequeath unto my S<sup>o</sup> sister Patience Fentress two other A/c. to her and her heirs forever (one of which is at this time in the hands of Henry Putten, and the other at Henry Dow's care)

Item 9<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto Sarah Fentress thirty pounds of Cotton (which is at Charley Crocker) to her and her heirs forever

I hereby I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved sister Patience Fentress my whole and sole Executrix to this my last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one

Elizabeth Kirk Will

In the name of God Amen, I, Elizabeth Kirk being of sound mind & memory do hereby bequeath, but such in strength, as make and ordain this my last Will & Testament.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I leave to my son James Kirk during his natural life negro woman Susan & man James, one bed and furniture, viz; 2 thick S. counterpane, 1 comfort, 1 Bedstead & 2 pillows, also 1 cow & calf & 1 cow & pig, first choice of stock, and at the death of my said son I give and bequeath all the property mentioned above to the heirs of my daughter Amanda Kirk lawfully begotten of her body, to them their heirs and assigns forever

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Sarah Ann Elizabeth Kirk one Counterpane to her and her heirs forever

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> It is my will that the whole of my Stock of every description be sold and after paying all my just debts out of the proceeds of said sale, the balance of said sale I give and bequeath unto the lawful heirs of my daughter Amanda Kirk lawfully begotten of her body to them their heirs and assigns forever

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Bellin & cuts. of this my last Will & Testament signed, sealed & delivered this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one
