Item 4th I give and bequeath unto Rebecca Pope daughter to be as above the sum of one dollar to her and her heirs forever

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my sister Patience Tattersall two feather Beds and furniture (which I have used this time in the case and at the residence of Henry Putten) to her and her heirs forever, also all my wearing tools which are in the care of John Putten, I give and bequeath unto her the S^d Patience Tattersall and her heirs forever also some kind of things (at Charity Crocker) to her and her heirs forever.

Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my dear son Boy Hunt Oakland, Pope son Captain Track or parcel of land containing by estimation more or less one hundred and nine acres to be equally divided between them the S^d Boy Hunt & Oakland, Pope, provided they should return to this County and give for the same, to them and their heirs forever but if they or their heirs should not come forward or otherwise apply for the same I then bequeath the same to my sister Patience Tattersall and her heirs forever, the same land being at this time in the possession of Nathaniel Allen,

Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my S^d sister Patience Tattersall the sum of thirty five dollars in money (which is at this time in the hands of attorney Henry Putten) to her and her heirs forever also all my other money now in Bond or open note, I also give and bequeath unto her the S^d Patience Tattersall and her heirs forever

Item 8th I also give and bequeath unto my S^d sister Patience Tattersall two shillings to her and her heirs forever (one of which is at this time in the hands of Henry Putten, and the other of Henry Bowden)

Item 9th I give and bequeath unto dear friend thirty pounds of Cotton (which is at Charity Crocker) to her and her heirs forever

Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved sister Patience Tattersall my whole and sole executrix to this my last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one

In the name of God Amen, I, Elizabeth Kirs being of sound mind & memory do hereby bequeath to be as above, the sum of one dollar to her and her heirs forever

Item 1st I leave to my son James Kirs during his natural life my negro woman named Sarah, and her and her furniture, my 2 black 3 year old ponies, 1 cow, 1 pig, 1 Red Bull & 1 pig, also 1 cow & calf, 1 cow & pig, first choice of stock, and at the death of my said son I give and bequeath all the property mentioned above to the heirs of my daughter Amanda Kirs lawfully begotten of her body, to them their heirs and assigns forever

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Sarah Ann Elizabeth Kirs and her heirs forever

Item 3rd It is my will that the whole of my stock of every description be sold and after paying all my just debts out of the proceeds of said sale, the balance of said sale I give and bequeath unto the lawful heirs of my daughter Amanda Kirs lawfully begotten of her body to them their heirs and assigns forever

Item 4th I nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Bellin & co. of this my last will & testament, signed, sealed & delivered this 15th day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one
