Thomas Garner's Will.

In the name of God ameu I Thomas Garner of the County of Northampton and state of N Carolina knowing it appinted unto me now to die do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following to wit.

Item 1^o It is my will & desire that my brother Bradford Garner shall have my half of a fishing place called & known as the high Islands fishing place in Roanoke River or Bradfords falls - also my shot gun which he is to take possession at my decease.

Item 2^o It is my will and desire that my wife Nancy Garner shall have the pectoral of her fathers estate which is due me in right of her also my Cow & calf and sow and sheats to her her herd & all goats forever.

Item 3^o It is further my will and desire that my wife Nancy Garner shall have the tract of land called the shorewood, intituled to me by my uncle Mr. Garner, at the death of my father during her natural life or widowhood and if she die without an heir by me begotten it is then my wish that my brother Bradfords Garner should have the said land.

Item 4^o It is my will & desire that my excutor hereafter appointed shall sell my crop of Cotton now on hand, and together with what money I have by me pay all my just debts and retain the remainder if any in his hands for the benefit of my said wife Nancy Garner as she may need it.

Item 5^o It is my will that my wife Nancy Garner shall have all the rest of my estate which I have not disposed of during her natural life or widowhood & if she die without a lawful heir by me begotten it is then & in that case my will and desire that my brother Bradford Garner shall have it.

Item 6^o And lastly I do hereby appoint David W. Matthews Executor to

this my last will & testament revoking by this all other wills hertofore by me made In writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23rd day of March 1837

Item I give to my sister Tempery all my stock of horses Cattle Hogs household & Kitchen furniture of every description together with all my plantation tools & utensils with my present stock of provisions together with the Crops now on the ground to her and her heirs forever - Item I bind to my Item I stand with my sister Tempery, Uncle Dabney Cawthon and his wife Sarah Cawthon during their lifetime for them to have a comfortable home so long as they may live the tract of land wherein I now live -

Item After the death of my said sister Tempery Uncle Dabney Cawthon and his wife Sarah I give to the youngest surviving daughter of my said Uncle Dabney Cawthon and his wife Sarah my tract of lands and the two negroes above mentioned to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my sister Tempery and her heirs forever my crop of Cotton now on hand and all the debts owing to me and all other species of property that I own after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses -

It is my will & desire that there by no inventory or sale I hereby nominate and appoint my sister Tempery Cawthon of this my last will and testament. In writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of May one thousand eight hundred

and thirty dollars.

In the name of God amen I Nathaniel Harris of the County of Northampton
and State of North Carolina being weak and infirm in body but in perfect
mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form as follows:

First I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken to be buried in
a decent and Christian like manner and my soul I return into the hands
of god who gave it and as for my worldly goods I give and bequeath
in manner and form as follows:

First I leave to my beloved wife Mary Harris child Cow and Calf during
her life or widowhood I also leave to her all my household furniture
as it stands at this time during her life or widowhood except such
articles as is of no use to her except one feather bed and furniture I
give to my daughter Jane Harris at the age of twenty one years
or sooner if she marries I wish my stock of hogs at my deceas sold
and I also wish all the debts due me at my deceas collected and the
money put out in trust for the support of my family so far as it
will go and at the end of the life or widowhood of my wife Mary
Harris I wish all the above property with its increase to be sold
and equally divided among my living children and my deceas Harris
I wish her to shool until he arrives to the age of fifteen years and
then put out to the Taylor trade until he arrives at the age of
twenty one years and at that time if my wife is living and unmarried
I still wish her to return the property I have loaned her & the bal
ance of the money if any I wish divided equally between my
daughter Jane Harris [&] my son James Harris
and all the property that belongs to me

that I have not named I wish sold and the proceeds appropriated
as above I also wish my family supported and provided for in the
best manner that the sircumstances of my estate will admit I
also wish at my deceas all my just debts paid and I appoint
Richard Moore Esq to this my last will and testament in

all my lands and tenements all of my negroes all other kind of property what
ever that I may be in possession of at my death after my just debts be
funeral expenses are paid but in case my beloved wife marry again I leave
I bind unto my son George W Pledger the use of my negro named Cleary
Nancy & Elizabeth in during of his natural life & after his deceas it is my
will & desire that the above named negro shall be equally divided between
all my sons George W Pledger boy children to them and their heirs forever
Item 3rd I bind unto my daughter Sally Banks if in case she should be left with
out any home a piece of land from the road along the ditch up the middle
fence line during of her natural life or widowhood

Item 4th I bind the use of all my Land and plantation to my son George W.
