Josephus D. W. Lawrence's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Josephus D. W. Lawrence of the County of
Northampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and
recollection before God, though decline from bodily infirmities, and
knowing that all must one day die, do make & ordain this to be my
last Will & Testament hereby revoking all others.

I do now will that my old negro man Jipps should be left to the care of
my Brother Thomas Lawrence and his representation and it is my wish that he
should be supported in his old age out of some portion of my property
in amongst his being of a faithful and useful servant to me, my
will is that the old man should be supported when he becomes unable to support him
self.

I also do now will to my dearest beloved wife Elizabeth R. Lawrence during her natural
life or until her death all the property which I may die leaving and
possessing, for the support of herself and my beloved son William
Lawrence and should I have no lawful or valid widow surviving
at my natural death I do will that my child die without a lawful
widow at my natural death at the age of maturity, at the death of my
dearly beloved wife Elizabeth R. Lawrence it is my will that my
property should be equally divided between my three nephews, sons
of my brother Thomas Lawrence (viz) John Thomas Lawrence,
William Josephus Lawrence and James Heron Lawrence to
them & their heirs forever.

Item, I will my beloved brother Thomas D. Lawrence to act as Guardian for
my young children William Thomas Lawrence, and in the event of my
not having a lawful heir whom my wife at the age of maturity
in the event of my childrens death it is my will that my said brother
Thomas Lawrence should act as agent for my wife during his natural
life, and Lawrence, William Josephus Lawrence, and James
Heron Lawrence.

(Lastly) I hereby appoint my dearly beloved brother Thomas D. Lawrence
executor of this my last will & testament
to sign, seal and subscribe in presence of us
the second day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.

John Putrell Will

In the name of God Amen John Putrell of the County of Northampton
& State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound mind memory
thank be to God for the same & knowing that it is appointed of God for
all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & Testament
in manner & form following (viz) Item I leave unto my daughter
Suzanna Putrell the house whereon my son Willie Putrell now lives to
gether with the lands lying on the west side of the branch running
through my plantation or so much thereof as I may think proper
& cultivate. Also the two rooms in the west end of my house with
one fire place so long as she may live single and no longer & also
land unto my daughter Suzanna Putrell my two negro men Henry
During his natural life also give & bequeath unto daughter Suzanna
Putrell my three negro master & Indentured servants & their wives
the two feather beds of furniture two Calico Pillows one horse bridle
& saddle five head of Sheep two cows & pigs one riding Cig & Harness
One trunk One Chest One table One chair while One bedroll which
she wherein One Chair & three common Chairs & one fifth part of
all my plates & cups & earthen wear six knives of steel often barrels
& Corn six hundred pounds of bacon one Iron pot blacked first choice
& his other heirs forever. Item my will & desire is that my daughter Suzanna
my dear & dearest to some person within the limits of his wife & the money arising
from the sale of said negro man & give Brigham unto my son John Putrell
together with all the property I have heretofore given him to him & his
heirs forever it being his full share of my Estate. Item I leave unto
my daughter Mary Lamberton the lands & plantation that I purchased
of Thomas Brooks & my negro girl named Margaret During her natural
life & at her death to be equally divided amongst all the living chil-
dren I also give Brigham unto my daughter Mary Lamberton
all the property that I have heretofore given her to her & her heirs forever
Item I give Brigham unto my dearest friend Patrell my negro man to work together
with all the property that I have heretofore lent him to him & his
heirs in his share & in full of my estate

Item I give Brigham unto my Elizab Putrell my negro boy mares to her
the heirs forever & also leave unto my son Elizab Putrell my chewing
tobacco, two mule, Mazy & Hanah & their increase during his natural
life & at his death to his heirs lawfully begotten of his body best if my
son Elizab shall die without a lawful begotten heir my wife & wife is
that my four said negroes to wit, the mule Mazy & Hanah be equally
divided between my two young daughters Sarah Putrell & Maria Putrell
two daughters of my son Willie Putrell to them & their heirs forever
that being my son & Elizab Putrell share of any estate
