Item I stand with my beloved wife Rachel Parker the on half of my plantation with my Manton house and all my out houses during her widowhood. I also give her the on half of the money and notes which is or may be found in my house which I have not already given away. I also lend her the on half of my household & kitchen furniture, also the on half of my negroes and the on half of my stock of all kinds say hogs Cattle &c. &c. also the on half of my plantation interests

Item My will and desire is for the balance of my property which is not already given away to belong to my son Willie Parker say my land plantation my negroes household kitchen furniture my stock of all kinds which may remain at my wife Rachel's death say all the property which I have lent unto the said Rachel Parker to her and her heirs forever

My will and desire is for my son Willie Parker to take the care or the guardianship of my son in law David & Dutelle until he arrives to full age, or to the age of twenty one year and I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Willie Parker and Lewis Woodard my sole and sole Executors to this my last will and testament disannulling all former will hereby me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 17th day of August 1820

 Anthony and Gabriel to him and his heirs forever -
- Item I give unto my son Nathaniel Glover the following negroes, Charles and
 Beauce together with one bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever -
- Item I give and bequeath to my son John and son Glover one bed & furniture & the
 following negroes to wit, one negro woman named Fanny two negro boys
 named Anderson & Geim, two negro girls named Cherry and Abby with
 all their future increase to him and his heirs forever -
- Item After the death of my wife my will and desire is that all my entire
 real personal real & personal not especially given and bequeathed be
 equally divided between my grand daughter Mary Gladish, my grand
 son John Glover Jr. & my sons John Glover Sr. Nathaniel Glover &
 Alexander Glover to each a share -
- Item Lastly I recommend and appoint John Glovers and Alexander Glover
