

William Mann's Will

I William Mann of County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do hereby certify the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

Item 1st. My Executors hereafter named shall provide for my Body a decent Burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whosoever owing out of the Money that my just come into his hands as a part or parcel of my Estate -

Item 2nd. I leave unto my beloved wife Mary Mann ~~all~~ my Estate after paying all my just debts, during her natural life -

Item 3rd. At the death of my beloved Wife Mary Mann I give unto my grand daughter Marysey Bridges one feather Bed and furniture, one glass Chest, and glass Table, one spinning Wheel & Cards, one Ladies saddle, four sitting Chairs, one pair flat Iron, one Cow & Calf, one female pig & Horses, to her & her heirs for ever -

Item 4th. I give and bequeath unto Joseph Bridges one feather Bed & furniture, to him and his heirs for ever -

Item 5th. At the death of my beloved Wife Mary Mann it is my Will and desire for all my Estate not mentioned to equal divided between my grand Children (W.) Marysey Bridges, Harriet Bridges, Wiler Bridges, & Burgess Bridges to them and their heirs for ever -

Item 6th and lastly I do nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Bridges my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament - In Witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st day of Sept. 1844 - William Mann

Nathan Britton's Will

In the name of God Amen - Knowing that it is once appointed for all men to die - I Nathan Britton of Northampton County NC. being of sound mind and memory do make this Will to contain my last Will and Testament revoking all others made herebefore by me -

Item 1st. I leave unto my beloved Wife Sally Britton all of my Estate after paying all my just debts consisting of my Lands and plantations that I now live on with eleven Acres, also two negroes namely, Jeffery and Sarah, also all my provisions now on hand all my stock of every kind all my household and kitchen furniture together with all my plantation interests during her natural life or widowhood - My Will and desire is that my Wife Sally Britton shall have it in her power to make sale of any part of my Estate that she wishes to dispose of to raise a sufficient quantity of money to pay off all my just debts - Also it is my Will and desire that my Wife Sally Britton shall not settle any person on my Lands, as long as she lives as I deal with my Lands and Tenures destroyed by any other persons only by my own family - &c -

Item 2nd. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary J. Murriel the sum of twenty five dollars it being her full Legacy of my Estate to be paid after the death or marriage of my Wife Sally Britton -

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath unto my son Jeph W. Britton the sum of twenty five dollars it being his full Legacy of my Estate to be paid after the death or marriage of my Wife Sally Britton -

Item 4th. It is my Will and desire that at the marriage or decease of my Wife Sally Britton that all the property that I have but he should be equally divided amongst my
sons and daughters
