

I hereby nominate my friend John White my Executor to this my last will &c In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of December 1826.


1st. I have my body to be buried in decent Christian like manner and the expenses to be paid by my Executor hereafter named -

5th. It is my will that the balance of my property not heretofore given away be sold by my Executor hereafter named and the money arising from such I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Lester to her and her heirs forever -

6th. I nominate and appoint my son Eliasha McDaniel and John Miller my Executor to this my last will and testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my this 12th day of June 1826 -
