Moses Norwood's Will

Hall of North Carolina Northampton County April the 28<sup>th</sup> one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven I Moses Norwood being in a usual state of mind and in my senses in the name of god do make this my last will and testament amen

Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Norwood one hundred and twenty five acres of land lying west of my dwelling house beginning in the Custer line below the spring a little west of said spring thence at stock come up to my dwelling house on through the entry of said house through the plantation in Minsey Jones line I also give her one negro man named Addison one negro girl named Lucy one feather bed and furniture one horse called John to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my son Littleton M. Norwood the following property to it in negro boy named John one named JAMES and one half of the lands I hold of the tract formerly belonged to my brother Samuel Norwood to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my son Peter M. Norwood the following property in one negro boy named Wilder, one slave named Harolds and I give him other half of the tract of land that I have given my son Littleton Norwood to him and his heirs forever.

Item I bind unto my daughter Mary Norwood one negro woman named Samm one negro girl named Tilly and if she should not have a lawful issue the negroes I bind her I give unto such issue share & share alike Take and her the balance of the tract of land I now have not given away to my wife this side the creek as long as she remained single and if ever she marries the lands to be sold and the money arising from sale of such land to be equally divided between all my children share & share alike

Item I bind unto my daughter Isabella M. Norwood the following property to it one negro girl named Nancy and one feather bed which she had in her possession to her and her heirs forever

Item I give unto my son Littleton M. Norwood and Peter M. Norwood and Mary Norwood one beds & furniture a pair - and the balance of my estate that is not given away all to be sold and after paying my just debts to be equally divided between my wife and all my children except my son W. C. Norwood share and share alike my will and desire is to give unto my son Williamson M. Norwood two hundred and fifty dollars out of my estate my wife and all my children to pay to my son Williamson his two hundred and fifty dollars share & share alike. I appoint my wife and my son Littleton M. Norwood Executors to this my last will and testament the day and date above written -

This last will and testament of Moses Norwood deceased was exhibited in open court and proved in due form of law by the oaths of Henry Poole and Henry P. High two of the subscribing witnesses thrice and attested to be certified and recorded. Whereupon Littleton M. Norwood & Annwoods the Executor & Executrix therein named qualified according to law
