Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Annina Lafayette one hundred Dollars to she and her heirs forever.

Item My will and desire is that all my stock of horses and carted sheep hogs also all my Crop of Corn Tobacco Cotton plantation animals &c. Eggs Cakes shall be sold also all my household Kitchen furniture that is not mentioned before shall be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising from the sale to pay this Legacy given to Annina Lafayette and all my just debts also my will and desire is that all my negroes that not given away before shall be hired out until my son Harrison C. Lafayette comes to be twenty one years of age then the hire and negroes to be equally divided between all my children to wit, Persula, Susan, Tabitha Lafayette, Julia Lafayette, Persula Woodard, Harrison C. Lafayette, Charles Lafayette also the balance after paying my debts to be equally divided amongst the above named children.

And I do nominate and appoint my two Executors W. B. Lockhart and James M. Wood, he and sole Executors of this my last will and testament disannulling all other wills heretofore made by me as Witness my hand and seal this first day of August 1827.

Item I give and bequeath unto Lemuel Patrick for nothing to him this his present Item I give unto my grandson David Parker Patrick one feather bed, furniture, and the feather bed on further bed, on further bed on further plates one gun also two notes which I hold against Lewis Woodard and Isaac Carter

to the amount of about one thousand Dollars but if the said David Parker & Patten shall die without lawful issue my will and desire is for the aforementioned property to descend to my wife Rachel Parker and my son Miller Parker to them and their heirs forever.

Item I stand unto my beloved wife Rachel Parker the one half of my plantation with my Mansion house and all my out houses during her widowhood. I also give her the one half of the money and notes which is or may be found in my house which I have not already given away. I also lend her the one half of my household & kitchen furniture, also the one half of my negroes and the one half of my stock of all kinds say hogs cattle &c. &c. also the one half of my plantation interests.

Item My will and desire is for the balance of my property which is not already given away to belong to my son Miller Parker say my land plantation my negroes household kitchen furniture my stock of all kinds which may remain at my wife Rachel's death say all the property which I have lent unto the said Rachel Parker to her and his heirs forever.

My will and desire is for my son Miller Parker to take the care of the guardianship of my son in law David Patten until he arrives to full age, or to the age of twenty one years and I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Miller Parker and Lewis Woodward my sole and sole Executors to this my last will and testament disannulling all former will hereby me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 1st day of August 1820.
