I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Adeline Lafete one hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever.

My will and desire is that all my stock of horses and cattle should go also all my Crop of Corn & other Cotton plantation items by Cedar Creek shall be sold also all my household Kitchen furniture that is not mentioned before shall be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising from the sale to pay this Legacy given to Adeline Lafete and all my just debts also my will and desire is that all my negroes that are not given away before shall be held out until my son Garrison Lafete comes to be twenty one years of age then the house and negroes to be equally divided between all my children to wit Dennis, Joseph, Valentine Lafete, Isla Lafete, Priscilla Woodard Garrison & Lafete Charles Lafete also the balance after paying my debts to be equally divided amongst the above named children.

And I do nominate and appoint my two Executors W. B. Schellhardt and James A. Wood, her and sole Executrix of this my last will and testament disannulling all other wills herefore made by me as witness my hand and seal this first day of August 1827.

I give and bequeath unto Leon and Fratice for shelter to him the house facing upon my land near David Parker's residence on feather bed furniture, one blue painted chair one piano dot, one piano box one piano plate one glass also two robes which should agree to Lewis Woodard and Leon Carter

to the amount of about one thousand Dollars but of the said David Parker & Trustee shall due without lawful issue my will and done is for the aforementioned property to descend to my wife Rachel Parker and my son Will Parker to them and their heirs forever.

Item I bind unto my beloved wife Rachel Parker the one half of my plantation with my Master house and all my out houses during her widowhood. I also give her the one half of the money and notes which is or may be found in my house which I have not already given away. I also bind her the one half of my household & kitchen furniture, also the one half of my negroes and the one half of my stock of all kinds say howe Catch hoggs & also the one half of my plantation servants.

Item - My will and done is for the balance of my property which is not already given away to belong to my son Will Parker say my Land plantation my negroes household kitchen furniture my stock of all kinds which may remain at my wifes Rachels death say all the property which I have left unto the said Rachel Parker to him and his heirs forever.

My will and done is for my son Will Parker to take the care or the guardianship of my son in law David P. Britton until he arrives to full age, or to the age of Twenty one years and I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Will Parker and Lewis Woodard my late and sole Executrix to this my last will and testament disannulling all former wills hereby one made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 17<sup>th</sup> day of August 1820.
