that I Isiah Parker of the County of Southampton State of New York do hereby
do make this my will This 8 day of first month 3 the year of our Lord (Christ)
One thousand eight hundred and thirty
First do my will and leave that my wife Abigail have of the House and plantation
where we now live all or any part as she may think proper with any or all the
property (that is beneath in the following lines) that she may choose to keep
together during her lifetime—
