

Codicil

I desire that all of the negroes before mentioned that are left to be sold instead of credit must be sold for cash down and as soon as the money that is raised out of my estate to be paid over to the Legatees as soon as collected.

The tract of which I purchased of Edward Nolley and others lying on Roanoke River containing one hundred forty acres & a half known by the name of the Bell tract I desire to be sold to the best advantage and to be given to my dearest sister Mary, children except Bennet Young for whom I make no provision concerning said Land &c.

John B. Glover's Will In the name of God Amen I John Glover of the County of Northampton in State of North Carolina do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit First I give to my Daughter Eliza Glover one feather bed and furniture--

Secondly I give to my son Seth P. Glover one horse saddle & bridle worth one hundred and fifty dollars-- Thirdly I leave to my beloved Wife Mary Glover in sum of Seven all the rest of my Estate of every nature and kind whatever during her natural life and it is to pay all of my just debts and losses and clothes and school all my Children will until they arrive of Lawful age Except my daughter Eliza Glover and my son

Seth P. Glover -

Fourthly I give all the aforesaid property I owned to my wife to be equally divided at her death between my Daughters Eliza Glover Mary Glover and my sons John Glover and Jones Glover --

Fifthly It is my Will and desire that if either my Daughters or the Glover slaves or my sons John Glover or Jones Glover should arrive of Lawfull age before the Death of my Wife Mary Glover then and in that case they are to receive the one half of what would be their share at the death of my said wife --

Lastly I nominate and appoint my friend Richard W. Leeks

Executor to this my Last will and Testament revoking all other Wills

Mason, Lester, George, Simon, David & Lucy, one bed furniture to her and her heirs for ever This I give unto my daughter Millie Bostick the following negroes Daniel, Charity, Hale, Mary, Lydia, Job & Wm. and bed and furniture to one gray mare to her and her heirs for ever

Folby I give to my son John Perry the following negroes namely
as follows sonne the son of Sol & Lender to him and his
heirs for ever -
Folby I give to my grand daughter Dorothy Lawrence one Trunk
etc I give to my grand son William Homes one bed
etc I give to my grand son John C. Lawrence and sonnely
etc I give to my grand son John Perry after paying my Just debts
all the balance of my estate not before suspey of

man and Sallye Johnson Bob and Bella two Leather Bids and furniture
one Horse named Broke and harned Nancie two Cow and
Calves two Ewes and Lamb two Lambs and Pig & strong Chairs two spin-
ning wheels and two pair Chards the Room and all give two Chest two
Tables and all the kitchen Furniture and Farming Utenciles and the Cat
and Whels to her and her heirs forever also the Land wherein I now
live during her natural life or widowhood
I do give and bequeath unto my son Richardum Powell one Negro man named
Baphraum and also my land after Death or marriage of my belovd
Wife Holland Powell to him and his heirs forever
I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Elias Powell one
Negro girl named Eliza Feathr Bed and furniture one cow

and Calf to her and her Heirs forever
I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Polly Powell one Negro girl
Cherry one Leather Bed and Furniture one Cow and Calf to her and her heirs
for ever
my Will and devise is at my death after paying my Just debts that all the remaining
part of my negroes not given away and other Property be equally divided
among all my Children to wit Negro Johnson, Richard, Cherry
Polly, and Polly Powell together with their Heirs forever including
my Daughter Sarah Davis two sons named Elias and Richard
and lastly I do nominate and appoint my son Richard Powell my
sole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament I do witness
givem here unto let my hand and seal this Twenty ninth day of
December one thousand eight hundred and thirty two

Elias Vicks Will In the name of God Amen I Elias Vicks
of the County of Northampton State of North Carolina being weak in Body
but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God omnipotent
mold the Mortal of my body and knowing that is appointed for all men
once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that
I do say first of all give and remand my soul into the
Hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent
and Christian forme and as touching such worldly Estate wherewithal I am possessed
a god to keepe in this life I give, devise, and despose of the same in the following
manner and forme

I do give to my son James Vick the tract of land that he now possess belonging
to land adjoining the same bounded as follows beginning at a corner post between
a street line to the common line thence a street Post to the corner of the Courts thence
up the crook to the corner of Shadwell land thence along said line to Amos Comer
including the exchequer of the land in one tract I give to my son James Vick one Bed
furniture that he has possessed all one horse saddle and bridle that he has possessed
long but can not be given in full
I do give the balance of my lands to be equally divided between my two sons Richard
Vick and Henry Vick but my wife Eliza Vicks to have the privilage of one
third part thereof during her life

I do give to my son Elias Vick one negro boy named Joshua also one saddle and
bridle he has in possession and one Gun he has in possession

4th I give to my Daughter Edna Vicks one negro girl named Harriet and
her increase to her and her heirs forever one Walnut Table

I bind to my wife Eliza Vicks one negro woman named Martha and her increase
during her life and at her death she shall have negro woman Eliza Vick and her increase
equal to be equally divided between myself Elias Vick and my Daughter Edna
Vicks - I do give to my wife Eliza Vicks one feather Bed and four sets of
Linens and gear and a Morgan Saddle and Spinning Wheel. This I do give to
my wife Eliza Vicks to be the pleasure also all the balance of my property gotten
paying my Just debts I leave to my wife Eliza Vicks During her life and
at her death whatever is left I give to be equally divided between my
