my stock of every kind and nature together with all my household & kitchen furniture my
writs and causes that are touching to her & that are necessary together for the benefit of
my dear wife and children & it is my will that of from the proceeds of the after named
property my wife have my children in the best possible manner

Article 3 be the death of my dear wife, her estate & give all the above named property to be equally divided between my dear Children namely James Curtis Seaverns and Sally Seaverns also Eliza Seaverns also to whom Henry Seaverns and I promise that my dear Wife shall be the Mother of my Child or Children within the space of seven Months after my death that said Child or Children shall be entitled to an equal share of all the above named property and money. The intention of the above is that my dear Wife keep our my estate and Children together until her death the above named property without increase or be equally divided between our my Children

Susanna Harding's Mill

In the Name of God Amen, I Perenna Harding of the County of Aitkin in the State of North Carolina being of sound of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament bearing to mind the mortality of Man and that it is appointed for us to die, I recommend the Soul to God who gave it and hope of a joyful resurrection of the same, and as to what worldly goods it has pleased God to bless me with I give of in the following manner (To-wit) -

I have and bequeath to my son Richard Manning, this estate to him and his heirs
 I have and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca, I locate the hundred acres to
 be paid her by my Executor Ten dollars annually until the whole is paid. You and
 the love of the children are I give to my son James to have my and Sons Manning to them
 and their heirs forever

Wm. L. give and say as to his daughter Martha & Sophia. Her kind regards to her and
her love forever

Now & then I give and bequeath to my beloved Son & Son our hundred acres to be retained in the hands of my Executors untill he arrives to the age of twenty one years and then for him to receive the same with interest from the time of the settlement of my estate to him and his heirs forever, provided he lives to become of age & then he can I give it to my Son James & Mary and my daughter Jane Harris & them and their heirs forever.

Item 5th After the payment of the above legacies, my last debts, and other expenses that may become I give and bequeath to my son James W. Harding and my daughter Jane Harris the whole of my Estate both real and personal to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son James W. Harding Executor to this my last will and Testament And of which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of January 1844
