

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Miller Furtell the lands & plantation where I now live except the part heretofore left to my surviving and her death the whole plantation to him this heirs forever. I also bequeath unto my son Miller Furtell my negro man Silas during his natural life and at his death to you & bequeath unto my grand daughter Susan Furtell this negro Silas to her this heirs forever.

I also give & bequeath unto my son Miller Furtell my three negroes (Sally, Ben Pleasant & Willis), also my Blacksmith tools & choice of books & baggage. Also Cup & com one half of my Cedar Chairs one washstand Table on oak table one desk on buffet one blue Chest two chairs two Chairs three Common Chairs one hance Saw one Cup cut saw & all my Carpenter & Carpenter tools two guns 1st Chair two combs & Cedar fine heads of ships One horse bridle & saddle one home mill & two down & pigs to him this heirs forever & bring to him of my estate Item at the death of my daughter Susanna Furtell, I give & bequeath unto my grand Susan Furtell my two negroes Caesar & Henry & her other heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sally Foyner my negroes one gelded stallion to her and her heirs forever I also leave unto my daughter Sally Foyner my three negroes (Sally, Isaac, Charissa) & children I leave during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided amongst all her heirs lawfully begotten of her.

Be it to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sally Foyner one feather bed & bed of arrimony to her other heirs forever.

Item I leave unto my daughter Mary Lambton one feather bed & furniture during her natural life & at her death I give the same to her children to them this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my step daughter Elizabeth Sommers one feather bed of arrimony to her other heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Anna Russell one feather bed of arrimony to her other heirs forever.

Item my will & desire is that the balance of my Bellesister Stephen Foyner we are to equally divide amongst my two daughters Sally Foyner & Mary Lambton & my two step Daughters Anna Russell & Elizabeth Sommers to them this heirs forever.

Item my will & desire is that all my money & slaves that may be found at my death be equally divided between my daughters Susanna Furtell & my Grand daughter Susan Furtell & daughters of my son Miller Furtell to them this heirs forever.

Item my next & desire is that all my property not heretofore given away be sold by executors & money arising from the sale of said property to be equally divided amongst my three daughters the Mary Lambton Susanna Foyner Sally Foyner & my two step Daughters Elizabeth Sommers & Anna Russell to them this heirs forever.

Lastly I do appoint Constitute & ordain my good wife with full power Thomas Foyner to have my son Miller Furtell wholly & fully contented to my last will & testament & my executors & administrators all with her help to my said wife to have & hold of my negro Silas & my land & plantation thereof I have hereto set my hand & affixed my seal this 2nd day of January 1834.

## Nicholas Popes Will

In the name of God Amen I Nicholas Pope of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina, being in perfect mind the weak in body, make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st this is my will and desire that all my property of every description be kept together during my living wife, Sally, widowhood or natural life, which ever may first happen.

Item 2d I leave to my living wife Sally for her support if herself and my children lawfully begotten of her body all my property both real and personal during her natural life or Widowhood, which may first happen, and at her death or marriage to be divided among my children in the following manner. To wit - My Land to be equally divided among my boys and my Girls to have as much of my personal Estate as will make their Estate equal to the real estate of my boys, and the balance if any to be equally divided among all my children.

Item 3d I do hereby constitute my living wife Sally my sole Executrix.

Signed and delivered this 2d day of February in the year of our Lord 1835.

It is also my will and desire that my boy Ben be left by my Executrix, and the proceeds be appropriated as above and also forth impower my Executrix to sue at my time she may think fit for any or all of my other Slaves that may refuse to be controlled by her.
