

Thomas D Brown's Will. In the name of God amen I Thomas D Brown of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in body but in sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit;

Item 1st In the first place I wish all my just debts to be paid.

Item 2nd I give unto my son Samuel Brown my gold watch to him this his forever

Item 3rd I give unto my son John Lewis Brown my smallest rifle to him this his
honor forever

Item 4th I wish Nathaniel Francis to become Guardian to my children and also it is my will that Mrs Sarah Moore should keep my children & should Mr Nathaniel Francis refuse to become their Guardian then it is my wish that Mrs Sarah W Moore should become so. It is also my wish and desire that my property should not be divided until one of my children becomes of age & gets married, then it is my will that it be equally divided among them. It is my will and desire that each of them to be equally supported out of the proceeds of my estate until one becomes of age & gets married.

Item 5th I give unto my worthy friend Arthur Parks my best pair suit of clothes (to me) Col fantaloons, waistcoat my best pair green socks & my best pair shoes and my blue Satin Stock Coats

Item 6th I give unto my brother John Lewis Brown two pair fantaloons, one pair white dallying and the other pair yellow and one bay waistcoat

Item 7th I have a parcel of Cotton gins on hand eight or ten more or less which are not completed & I wish for them to be completed, and it is my will and desire that my executors should dispose of them either publicly or privately as he may think most advantagous for the benefit of my estate

Item 8th I do constitute and appoint my friend Henry W Ivy Executor to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 5th August 1829 A.D.

In the name of God amen I Matthew Powell of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being at this time very weak in body but of a sound mind and memory thank be to god for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die, as for the worldly goods it hath pleased god to bless me

with I give in the following manner and form

Item I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Elizabeth Cannell the sum of five dollars to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Fennell the sum of Twenty Dollars to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Powells the sum of five dollars to him and his heirs forever

Item I leave unto my son Luke and his wife Rebekah Powells a negro woman by the name of Jim during their lives and after their death my will and desire is for the said Negro Jim to be sold and the money to be equally divided between the lawful begatthes child & of my son Mark Powells to them and their heirs forever

Item My will and desire is if there is any part of my property remaining after the legacies above mentioned are taken off & my just debts paid my will and desire is for the said money to be equally divided between the lawful begatthes children of Esrum Powells Richard Powells, William Powells, Mark Powells, Luke Powells, Lewis Powells and Anna Fennell to them and their heirs forever

and I do nominate and appoint my three executors Elielie Fittell James Fennell & William Fennell sole and sole executors of this my last will and testament desirous abling all other wills heretofore made by me as witness my hand and seal this 17th day of December 1828

Benjamin Rock's Will. In the name of God amen I Benjamin Rock of Northampton County State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner as follows

First I leave unto my son James Rock during his natural life the tract of land of lands he now lives on called Johnson's tract, and take land unto my son James Rock on other tract of land called Thinks tract beginning at the rock a corner between Suresy Mordey and myself a straight line to the head of a branch in Thinks field and down the branch to Cancer Creek, whence I leave unto my son James Rock the following negroes during his life Nancy, Hill, little Lucy, Peter, Joshua, little Bob, Susan, Mary, Anna, Priscilla Richards and little Lucy, young child the name not known, Howard, Jordan, and

Item Alfred, the last then named Negro I give unto my son James Rock to him and his heirs forever - also I give unto my son James Rock my black Smith tools I send unto my daughter Tabitha Vincent the following Negroes Freely, Robin - Hannah, Henry, Molly, Cat, Tom, Sarah, Brother, Maria, Thobie, Anna, Moses, Caswell, Manuels, and Ahma, and after the death of my daughter Tabitha Vincent I give the said land Negroes to her living children to share and share alike; and after the death of my son James Rock I give the said land and Negroes that I sent him to his living children to share and share alike -

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah Putney, old Cat, Peter Mary, Caroline, Barbara Putney Harbound, to her and her heirs forever - also lands unto my daughter Sarah Putney the following Negroes during her life and to dispose of them at her death to her nearest relatives as she thinks proper. Namely Nancy Turner, Cruiser, Peter, Frances & Isidore. Item I send lands unto my wife Lydia Rock the tract of Land I now reeke or during her life, beginning at Cane Creek at a mouth of a branch, that leads up unto Phelps field to a Cane tree on North side of the road Rosedale Court thence along my line to a Cane tree along my line to Cane Creek, thence down Cane Creek to the mouth of the branch. Also lands unto my wife Lydia Rock during her life the following Negroes. Billy big Tom, Jacob little Tom, Yellowdy, Politics, White Martin, Charles Lucy little Susan, old Susan and long, and after the death of my wife I send the tract of Land to my daughter Sarah Putney during her life, and to dispose of it at her death to her nearest relatives as she thinks proper. Also lands unto my wife all my household and kitchen furniture two Cow feet cheese two heads of horses Dolphin Hcate two stone flags, one thousand weight of pork, Seventy five barrels Corn, Seventy five pounds sugar fifteen pounds coffee, four Hucks black feeders and sheats sufficient to feed her Stock -

Item I give unto my son James Rock after the death of my wife, big Tom to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give unto my two daughters Tabitha Vincent Sarah Putney after the death of my wife one Negro man Jacob to be equally divided between them. Also give unto my daughter Sarah Putney after the death of my wife the following Negroes, old Susan, & Cruiser to her and her heirs forever -

Item I give unto my grand daughter Mary Stewart the following negroes after the death of my wife, Little Susan, little Tom and long to her and her heirs forever -

Item I give unto my grand daughter Lucy Vincent after the death of my wife the following Negroes, old Tom and Martin, to her and her heirs forever -

Item I give unto my grand son Milton Vincent after the death of my wife one negro girl Lizzie to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give unto my grand son Michael Vincent after the death of my wife one negro boy Politics to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give unto my daughter Tabitha Vincent all my little Island lying in Roanoke river to her and her heirs forever. Also give unto my two daughters Tabitha Vincent and Sarah Putney, one Negro man James to them and their heirs forever - and the balance of my estate to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my three children

James Rock, Tabitha Vincent and Sarah Putney after paying my just debts. I also appoint my friends James Vincent, John D. Putney and James Rock Executors to this my last will and testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the sixteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine

Putney two of the Executors therin named qualified as the law directs - (James Rock the other Executor named in said will refused to qualify) The parties James Vincent, John D. Knowing that it is my appointed for all men to die I Thomas Martin of Northampton County aforesaid being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and execute this writing to entreat my last will and testament in manner and form following, making and desanctifying herefore made by me

Item I send unto my beloved wife Amy Martin during her natural life or widowhood Fifty acres of Land including the Mansion house & other houses &c one bed and furniture also one Negro boy named Maxwell, one horse one Cow and Calf one pair chairs and spinning wheel full the house half dozen sitting chairs, one Pine Table -

Item It is my will and desire that the residue of my estate shall be sold and after paying my just debts, equally divided among all my children living to the years of twenty one years to wit Stephenson, Polly, Sally, Dorothy, Mariah, Penelope, Amy and James Thomas Carter Martin & Stephenson to have on my horse bridle and saddle etc to them and their heirs forever -

Item After the death or marriage of my beloved wife Amy Martin the part then remaining shall be sold and the proceeds of said sale be equally divided among the above legatees - Also I do appoint and nominate my beloved son Stephenson Martin my whole and sole Executor to the my last will and testament - Witness my hand and seal the 7th day of September One thousand eight hundred and twenty nine
